

Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

Project update | April 2022

As part of the More Trains, More Services program, we are upgrading Waterfall Station, the stabling yard and associated rail corridor infrastructure to accommodate the Mariyung fleet.

What's next at Waterfall?

In April, our main activities will include:

- installation of bridge support columns and supporting infrastructure for the new footbridge
- installation of the amenities building support structure
- relocating track in preparation platform extension work, and construction of new track which will include tamping machines and use of vibratory rollers
- installing new overhead wiring and signalling equipment, new drainage and cable route installation
- installation of a prefabricated signalling facility, requiring a temporary, single-lane

closure of the Princes Highway overnight. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists with these changes.

- electrical upgrade work at the Heathcote Rail Substation involving trenching work, vacuum trucks, a crane, and temporary traffic changes.

Upcoming night work

In April, some activities are required to take place outside of standard construction hours.

This work has been scheduled to take place during Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running, minimising disruptions to commuter services and improving the safety of our construction team and customers.

Night work will be carried out over the April long weekend, between **6pm Thursday 14 and 7am Tuesday 19 April 2022**.

Standard construction hours

From **1 April 2022**, standard construction hours will revert to **7am-6pm Monday to Friday and 8am-1pm on Saturdays**.

Temporary changes to commuter car parking and traffic movements

To support construction activities at Waterfall we require temporary use of approximately 30 commuter car spaces from **11pm Monday 11 until 6pm Thursday 21 April**.

We will also require an additional 20 spaces from **6pm Thursday 14 until 12am Tuesday 19 April**.



In April, we are also planning to complete the installation of an Ausgrid pole mounted transformer on the northern side of the Princes Highway, opposite Hanrob Pet Hotels. To safely facilitate the overhead wiring work, we will be temporarily closing lanes on the Princes Highway. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists with these changes.

Footbridge installation

We notified last year that we would be installing the new staff footbridge at Waterfall Station over the April long weekend requiring temporary closures of the southbound lanes of the Princes Highway. This work has now been postponed and will be undertaken between **Saturday 21 and Sunday 22 May 2022**. Further details regarding traffic management will be provided to residents and motorists closer to the date. Access to local

properties will be maintained with the assistance of traffic control.
