Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

More Trains, More Services

As part of the More Trains, More Services program, we are upgrading Waterfall Station, the stabling yard and associated rail corridor infrastructure to accommodate the Mariyung fleet.

What's next?

In August, we will continue construction activities inside the rail corridor in preparation for the platform extension, installation of the staff footbridge and amenities building, including:

- construction of new track and removal of old track which will include tamping machines and use of vibratory rollers
- installing new overhead wiring and signalling equipment, new drainage and cable routes and deep earth electrodes. This work will require use of vacuum trucks and drill rigs

- construction of staff footpaths within the rail corridor, as well as installation of new boundary and security fencing
- landscaping work adjacent to the Princes Highway
- installation of a new Ausgrid transformer on the western side of the Princes Highway, opposite Hanrob Pet Hotels. As this work will involve crane movements, cable pulling across the highway and the installation of supporting infrastructure on the side of the highway, intermittent traffic stoppages will be required.

Note: due to site conditions, re-prioritisation of activities and Ausgrid approvals, this work has been delayed from previous months.



Upcoming night work

Standard construction hours on this project are **7am-6pm Mondays to Fridays and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.**

Upcoming night work will take place on:

- **Monday 8 August 2022**
- **Wednesday 24 August 2022**
- **Monday 29 August 2022**

To improve safety of the community and staff, as well as minimise disruptions to commuters and motorists, some minor activities may be required to be completed outside of standard construction hours in August. We will contact you directly if out of hours work is anticipated to be noticeable at your address.

If we have not been able to install the prefabricated amenities building, as notified for in our July update, we have scheduled contingency dates between **Monday 1 and Friday 5 August**. As the installation involves crane movements on the Princes Highway and requires intermittent traffic stoppages, we will be completing this work at night. If you have any questions about this activity, please contact us through the formal avenues listed in the box below.

Traffic and parking impacts

To safely facilitate overhead wiring work and crane movements, we will be temporarily closing lanes of the Princes Highway **overnight on Wednesday 24 and Monday 29 August 2022.**

Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists with these changes.
