Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

Construction update

Over the next ten years the More Trains, More Services (MTMS) program will simplify and modernise the rail network, creating turn up and go services for many customers. The current stage of the program will deliver improvements for the T4 Eastern Suburbs & Illawarra Line, T8 Airport and South Line and South Coast Line customers.

Project overview

The main construction contract has been awarded to *Transport for Tomorrow*, comprising of Laing O'Rourke and KBR who will work in partnership with Transport for NSW to deliver all MTMS projects between Mortdale and Kiama, including Waterfall.

Site investigations and enabling work has started at Waterfall in preparation for the commencement of main construction activities which are expected to take around two years to complete.

Upcoming work

This month, preliminary site investigations and construction on the retaining wall in the rail corridor will continue.

To support the industry and continue the delivery of critical infrastructure, the NSW Government has introduced new rules allowing construction sites to operate on weekends and public holidays.

Standard construction hours are now 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, weekends and public holidays.

These changes have been made to facilitate social distancing on construction sites and support the health and wellbeing of workers.

In line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of Coronavirus and social distancing, all work will be carried out at a safe physical distance where possible and necessary hygiene practices will be observed.

Transport for NSW understands extending construction hours to weekends and public holidays may cause disruption for the community but all efforts will be made to minimise impacts where possible and ensure strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management are adhered to.

Night work

To minimise traffic impacts and service disruption, and to improve the safety of customers, workers and the community, some night work is required this month.

A temporary speed reduction will be in place on the Princes Highway between Bundarra Street and Eckersley Road from 80 km/h to 40 km/h, and traffic control will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians during this time.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience and will do everything we can to reduce noise where possible.
