

# More Trains, More Services

## Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project



### What's been happening?

As part of the More Trains, More Services Program, we are upgrading Waterfall station, the rail stabling yard and associated rail corridor infrastructure to accommodate a new fleet of longer trains.

Last month, it was announced that the New Intercity Fleet is being named 'Mariyung', the Darug word for Emu, in acknowledgement of local Aboriginal culture.

Our construction activities extend along a 2 kilometre stretch in the rail corridor between Waterfall station and Heathcote.

Just off the Princes Highway, we have been completing excavation activities, stabilising the embankments, installing underground services, relocating track, building traffic barriers, upgrading overhead wiring, and installing drainage.

We have improved Cawley's Road in Helensburgh to enable us to safely transport clean material to storage sites in the rail corridor.

The material will be available to the Rural Fire Service, National Parks and Wildlife Service and Sydney Trains for upgrading fire trails, roads, walking tracks and re-purposing within the rail corridor.

### What's next?

Our activities in the rail corridor will continue in June including track work, drainage relocations, upgrades to overhead wiring, signalling modifications and platform investigation activities.

Construction vehicles will continue to access the site using the truck bay off Princes Highway in order to transport construction materials and enable deliveries.

Excavated material will be transported from our site at Waterfall to the storage areas in the rail corridor at Helensburgh during standard construction hours (7am until 6pm).

In addition to this work, we will also begin installing some cable routes between Heathcote and Waterfall to upgrade utility services in the area.

## Night work

In June, some activities will be undertaken outside of standard construction hours (7am-6pm) for improved safety of our construction team and customers.

We will be working outside of standard construction hours from:

- **6pm Monday 31 May until 7am Friday 4 June**
- **11pm Wednesday 16 June until 5am Sunday 20 June**  
(Sydney Trains trackwork period)
- **7pm Friday 25 June until 2am Monday 28 June** (Sydney Trains trackwork period)

Scheduling our work to coincide with Sydney Trains track work periods, when no trains are running, minimises disruptions to commuter services and improves the safety of our construction team and customers.

## Temporary parking and traffic changes

From **5am Tuesday 22 June until 5pm Thursday 1 July**, we will reserve 50 commuter car spaces at Waterfall Station for:

- improved safety of our construction team, customers and commuters, including pedestrians and motorists
- safe access for Sydney Trains staff facilitating transport operations, including replacement bus services
- secure storage of project materials and machinery.



To safely enable the installation of cable routes inside the corridor between Waterfall Station and Heathcote, some minor traffic changes and vegetation pruning may be required on the Princes Highway.

We are working closely with Sutherland Shire Council on identifying local re-planting opportunities. If you would like to get involved, please contact us to express your interest.
