More Trains, More Services Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

More Trains, More Services

As part of the More Trains, More Services program, we are upgrading Waterfall Station, the stabling yard and associated rail corridor infrastructure to accommodate the Mariyung fleet.

What's next at Waterfall?

In June, our main activities will include:

- construction of new track and removal of old track which will include tamping machines and use of vibratory rollers
- installing new overhead wiring and signalling equipment, new drainage and cable routes and deep earth electrodes. This work will require use of vacuum trucks and drill rigs
- installation of a prefabricated amenities building inside the rail corridor, and an Ausgrid transformer on the western side of the Princes Highway, opposite Hanrob Pet Hotels
- construction of staff footpaths within the rail corridor, as well as installation of new boundary and security fencing
- electrical upgrade work at the Heathcote Rail Substation.

Traffic impacts

To safely facilitate overhead wiring work and crane movements, we will be temporarily closing lanes of the Princes Highway throughout June. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists with these changes.

Upcoming night work

Standard construction hours on this project are **7am-6pm** Mondays to Fridays and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.

To minimise traffic disruption on the Princes Highway, the installation of the prefabricated amenities building and Ausgrid transformer has been scheduled to take place at night, **between 6pm and 7am**.

Some deliveries will also take place outside of standard construction hours however this work is not expected to impact the community.

We understand construction activities may cause disruption for the community and every effort will be made to minimise impacts where possible, including conducting monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.



Changes to commuter car parking at Heathcote

To support construction activities at Waterfall we have reserved 30 commuter car spaces in the Heathcote commuter car park.



Impacted parking spaces

As we progress construction at Waterfall, we are essentially building ourselves out of space inside the rail corridor and have had to identify alternative options for staff parking. Traffic control will be in place during standard construction hours and traffic cones will be installed at night to assist commuters with these changes.

We will continue to monitor usage on a monthly basis and return these spaces to commuters should we identify a noticeable impact.

Bridge installation and closure of south-bound lanes on Pacific Highway

Between Saturday 2 and Sunday 3 July 2022, we will be installing the main body of the new staff footbridge during the night to minimise impacts on traffic.

This work will require closure of both south- bound lanes on the Princes Highway so a 400-tonne crane can safely lift in bridge segments. Traffic will be diverted to the northbound lanes which will operate as contraflow lanes, enabling both north and southbound lane traffic to move across a 1.6km stretch of highway. To safely facilitate traffic movements, we are also planning to restrict parking in local streets over one weekend.

In the coming weeks, we will be distributing more information about this work and visiting residents to discuss planned activities in more detail.
