

More Trains, More Services

Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

Over the next ten years the More Trains, More Services program will modernise the rail network providing more frequent train services, with less wait times, less crowding and more seats on a simpler, more reliable network.

What's the latest news?

Last month we completed night work during a scheduled Sydney Trains track-work period where no passenger services were running. This allowed the construction team to safely carry out essential activities inside the rail corridor. We would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the disruptive nature of this night work and thank you for your patience.

In August we:

- mobilised and demobilised a temporary site compound in the Waterfall Station car park
- completed major construction elements on the new retaining walls
- removed overhead wiring and associated infrastructure from the existing stabling yard
- started track removal and reconfiguration of signalling equipment
- established office facilities behind the existing truck bay off the Princes Highway.

What's coming next?

Activities being undertaken in September include:

- completion of work on the retaining walls, including drainage installation
- completion of enabling work and demobilisation of equipment, making way for main construction activities to progress
- establishment of site compounds
- track removal
- vegetation removal within the corridor to enable earthworks.



What do I need to know about construction hours?

Please remember that standard construction hours are now 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, weekends and public holidays, in line with new NSW Government rules to ensure we keep our work sites safe.



The project team understands extending construction hours to weekends and public holidays may cause disruption for the community and efforts will be made to minimise impacts where possible, and ensure we adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.

In line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of Coronavirus and social distancing, all work will be carried out at a safe physical distance where possible and necessary hygiene practices will be observed.

Will there be out of hours work this month?

To minimise traffic impacts and service disruption, and to improve the safety of customers, workers and the community, some out of hours work will continue in September:

- evening work: Tuesdays between 6pm and 10pm
- mid-week night work: Wednesdays and Thursdays between 6pm and 7am.
