## Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

### More Trains, More Services

As part of the More Trains, More Services program, we are upgrading Waterfall Station, the stabling yard and associated rail corridor infrastructure to accommodate the Mariyung fleet.

The new fleet will offer improved safety, accessibility, comfort and modern features for customers who make almost 45 million journeys a year on the electrified intercity network.

### What's the latest?

In September, our work at Waterfall Station will include:

- construction of staff footpaths within the rail corridor, as well as installation of new boundary and security fencing
- construction of new track and removal of old track which will include tamping machines and use of vibratory rollers
- continuing our installation of drainage, cable routes and deep earth electrodes. This work will require use of vacuum trucks and drill rigs.

### Construction hours

Standard construction hours on this project are **7am until 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am until 1pm on Saturdays.**

Some of our construction activities are required to take place outside of these hours.

## Upcoming night work

In September, most of our work is scheduled to be carried out during standard construction hours, however some adhoc activities will be required to take place outside of these hours.

We will be completing electrical commissioning activities between **Friday 16 and Monday 19 September**. This work is minor in nature and not anticipated to be noisy.

To minimise disruptions to motorists and improve the safety of the community and staff, we may be removing concrete barriers on the Princes Highway at night, when traffic flow is drastically reduced. This work will take place once we have finished installing the permanent concrete crash barrier.

We will contact you directly if out of hours work is anticipated to be noticeable at your address.

## Minimising community impacts

We understand construction activities may cause disruption to our closest neighbours, and every effort will be made to minimise the impacts where possible, including conducting on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration, and dust management.

## Plant a Tree Day with Waterfall Public School

On Friday 29 July, members of our project team put down their tools and left their desks to get involved with National Tree Day; Australia's largest community tree planting and nature care event.

The team met with the students of Waterfall Public School (all 18 of them) for a sustainability presentation, planting and platters.

Together we got our hands dirty, planting 30 native species into the school's Uncle Mick Ting memorial garden on the edge of the Royal National Park (the second oldest National Park in the world!)

After planting in oversized high-vis vests, safety goggles, hard hats and gloves, the students lined up for catering provided by Koori Kulcha Catering, which included crocodile chipolatas and kangaroo koftas.

A big thank you to our staff volunteers for making the day such a huge success!

We strongly believe we have an ethical and moral responsibility to drive sustainability throughout our core business and aim to leave a lasting legacy for the communities in which we work.

Sustainability is not an option on our projects, it is perceived as entirely essential, and we are fully committed to integrating sustainable practices into our projects to achieve environmental benefits.
