

Waterfall Enabling Work Project We want your feedback

The safety of our project team and the community is our top priority. Currently, project work is continuing on site in accordance with current government policies regarding COVID-19 and mitigation measures, including safe working practices, have been implemented.

Under normal circumstances TfNSW would be connecting with the community at Waterfall via face to face methods such as door knocking. We regret that due to the COVID-19 social distancing measures, we can't make contact with you this way.

Proposed changes to our night work program

We are seeking your feedback on a proposal to change the night work program from the current schedule to one week of five consecutive nights of work that would let us to complete work in your area as quickly as possible.

Due to high traffic volumes in your area we need to carry out work at night in order to minimise impact on the road network and keep motorists and our team safe.

Working five consecutive nights will reduce the overall construction timeframe, minimising the disruption period for residents, businesses and road users.

We are proposing to work up to five consecutive nights from 6pm to 7am on Tuesday 14 to Saturday 18 April. You will be notified prior to the start of the five nights if this proceeds.

Please note, if you do not provide feedback on the proposed changes to the night work program it is taken as approval for the changes to proceed.

What to expect

Night work activities will include:

- deliveries of large materials and plant
- excavations for the installation of utilities along the Princes Highway
- guard rail removal
- installation of traffic barriers.

Temporary speed reduction will be in place during night work on the Princes Highway between Bundarra Street and Eckersley Road from 80 km/h to 40 km/h. Traffic control will be in place during this time.

We have undertaken a noise assessment of the proposed work and identified appropriate mitigation measures in accordance with our planning approval processes. We will reduce the impact of noise wherever possible.

Equipment being used

This will include trucks, excavators, flood lights, powered hand tools and compaction equipment.
