More Trains, More Services

February 2023

Transport for NSW pays respect to Elders past and present, and recognises and celebrates the diversity of Aboriginal peoples and their ongoing cultures and connections to the lands and waters of NSW.

Transport for NSW is building a new substation within the rail corridor to create the necessary power supply to support the increase in the number of trains travelling along the T8 Airport Line in the future.

What's been happening?

In 2022 the team achieved several milestones bringing the project closer to completion. Most notably, the external construction of the substation was mostly completed, as well as an upgrade to the surrounding area with new landscaping. In addition, we improved water flow between residential buildings on Lusty Street and the rail corridor by installing a new channel to divert water.

The focus for 2023 will be completing the electrical fit-out within the substation and turning on the new power source to begin electrical testing.

What work are we doing?

In February 2023 the project team will undertake the following activities:

- continuing to fit out the substation and installing new fencing around the substation boundary
- installing cables, metal fixings and other electrical infrastructure to connect power from the substation to the track
- removing redundant signals and infrastructure within the rail corridor.

When and where we'll be working

Standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 7am to 1pm on Saturdays.

We'll be working inside the rail corridor and within the site compounds located at 5A and 25 Lusty Street. The map overleaf outlines locations of the work and site access points.

Out-of-hours work

Some work will take place outside of standard construction hours between 10pm Friday 17 February through to 5am Monday 20 February.

Out-of-hours work will take place during scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains will be running. Scheduling construction work outside of standard construction hours enables our project team to complete the activities safely.

All construction work is weather permitting and subject to change.

What will this mean for you?

To facilitate the delivery of plant and equipment into the rail corridor, there will be the temporary removal of approximately ten parking spots on Henderson Street, Turrella from 10pm Friday 17 February through to 5am Monday 20 February.

You may also notice:

- increased workers and vehicles in and near the site compounds
- noise from machinery and equipment.
