Wolli Creek Power Supply Upgrade project



What happened in October?

During October we continued with geotechnical, survey, potholing investigations inside the rail corridor. A temporary site was established to carry out non-destructive digging. This work was required to prepare for the start of main construction work of the substation.

What's planned next?

Throughout November, the project team will be continuing with geotechnical, survey, potholing investigations inside the rail corridor. The project team will also carry out vegetation clearing along the rail corridor to make way for the new substation that will upgrade the power supply for the rail network.

When will construction occur?

During November, construction will primarily take place from 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays.

Are there activities planned out of hours?

Some out of hours work is planned to complete surveys and geotechnical investigations. These works are taking place during a scheduled trackwork period when no trains will be running. This enables the construction team to safely carry out essential activities inside the rail corridor.

- Sunday 8 November to Friday 13 November from 11pm to 5am.

We do not expect this work to be noisy. These works are dependent on weather and site conditions and are subject to change.

How do we consider the community?

The project team understands construction activities may cause disruption for the community. Every effort will be made to minimise disruption to the community including limiting loud conversations near residential buildings, non-tonal reversing alarms for construction plant and vehicles and noise monitoring.

We will also ensure we adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.

How are we staying safe?

We continue to deliver projects across NSW while ensuring the safety of all staff and the community. In line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of Coronavirus and social distancing, all work will be carried out at a safe physical distance where possible and necessary hygiene practices will be observed.
