### More Trains, More Services

The More Trains, More Services program is delivering platform extensions and rail asset upgrades between Sydney's CBD and the South Coast to support the introduction of the Mariyung fleet.

#### Mariyung Fleet

The work being undertaken across South Coast stations will support the introduction of the new Mariyung fleet. This fleet has been called 'Mariyung', the Darug word for Emu in acknowledgment of the local Aboriginal culture.

The 55-train fleet with 554 new carriages will offer improved safety, accessibility, comfort and modern features for customers who make almost 45 million journeys a year on the electrified intercity network.

### We're approaching completion of construction in your area

With only minor activities left at Wollongong and Coniston, we're expecting to demobilise in mid 2022.

At Wollongong, we have some signal testing activities to complete, and some minor adjustments to make to the security fence before we remove our stored spoil and a couple of temporary sheds we've been working out of within the Sydney Trains' compound behind Gladstone Avenue.

Most of our work at Coniston is also complete and remaining activities include replacing train signals at the Bridge Street end of the platform, platform painting and additional testing work.

## Night work

Between January until March, some activities are required to take place outside construction hours (7am – 6pm).

This work has been scheduled to take place during a Sydney Trains trackwork period when no trains are running, minimising disruptions to commuter services and improving the safety of our construction team and customers.

Equipment for activities at night will be restricted to hand tools and is not expected to impact residents.

## Other agencies working in your area

To improve service reliability, other agencies such as Sydney Trains have also been completing track maintenance work in the rail corridor between Wollongong and Coniston.

## Car parking changes

To support construction activities, we will require the use of approximately 25 car parking spaces in the commuter car park south of Wollongong Station from **5pm Thursday 17 February until 7am**

**Tuesday 22 February 2022** (subject to approval).

Traffic control will reserve these spaces and signage will be installed closer to the date to advise motorists of these temporary changes.

## Minimising impacts

We understand that construction activities may cause disruption for the community and every effort will be made to minimise the impacts where possible, including:

- turning off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing alarms to reduce potential noise impacts to the surrounding community
- installing noise barriers to shield residents from high impact noise activities
- conducting on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.
