

## Night works on the Great Western Highway at Mount Lambie from 21 March

Essential maintenance work is taking place at Mount Lambie near Thorpes Pinch Road

The work includes asphaltting to provide an improved road surface near Thorpes Pinch Road. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

We will be working between **7pm** and **6am** from **Tuesday 21 March** and expect to complete the work in **four night**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

### How will the work affect you?

For the safety of motorists and out workers, work will be taking place at night. The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise completing nosier activities earlier in the night and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

### Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures and a 40km/h speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work. Outside of work hours reduced speed limits of 60km/h and 80km/h will be in place.

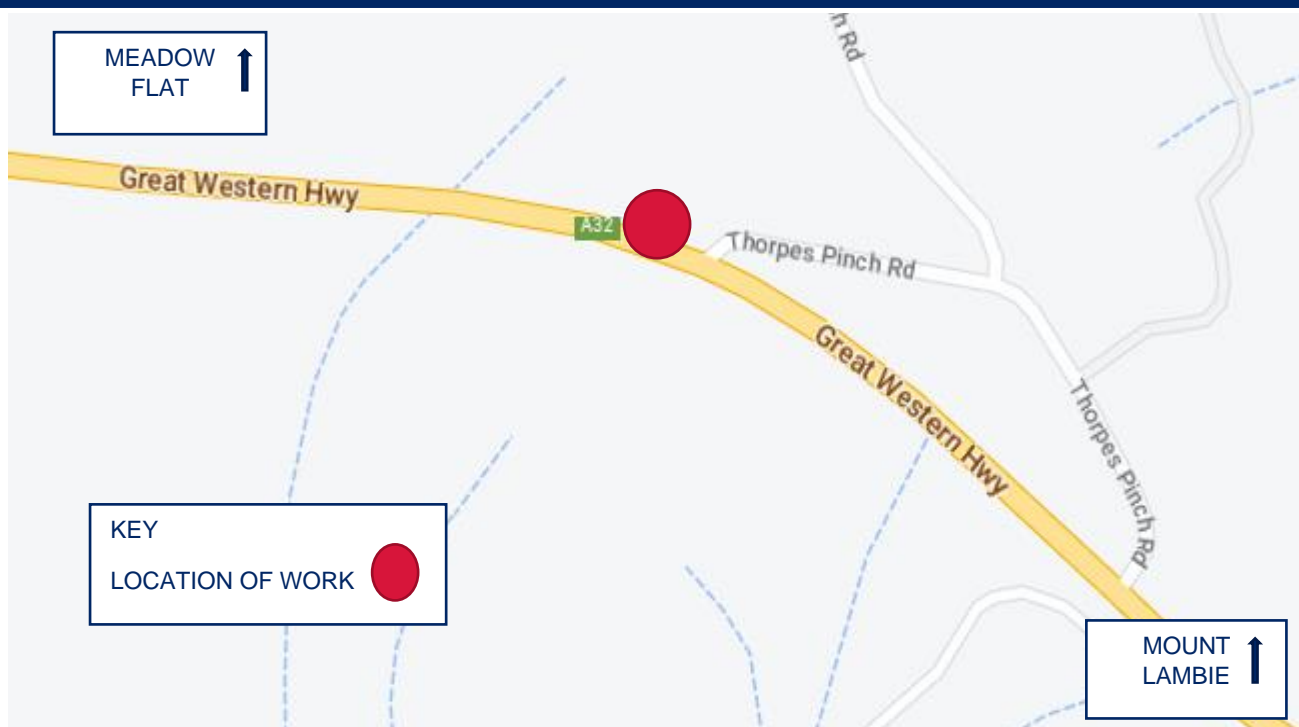
