

Changed traffic conditions on the Mid Western Highway at Carcoar from 15 March for essential maintenance work

Transport for NSW is carrying out asphaltting work from Wednesday 15 March on a 600-metre section of the Mid Western Highway at the intersection of Carcoar Dam Road. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

We will be working between **7am** and **5pm** from **Monday to Saturday** and expect to complete the work in four weeks, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Property access will be maintained at all times during work hours. Please exercise caution as you enter and exit the Highway and be aware of workers on the roadside.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures, intermittent stopping and 40km/h speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work. Outside of work hours, variable speed limits will be in place and signposted accordingly.

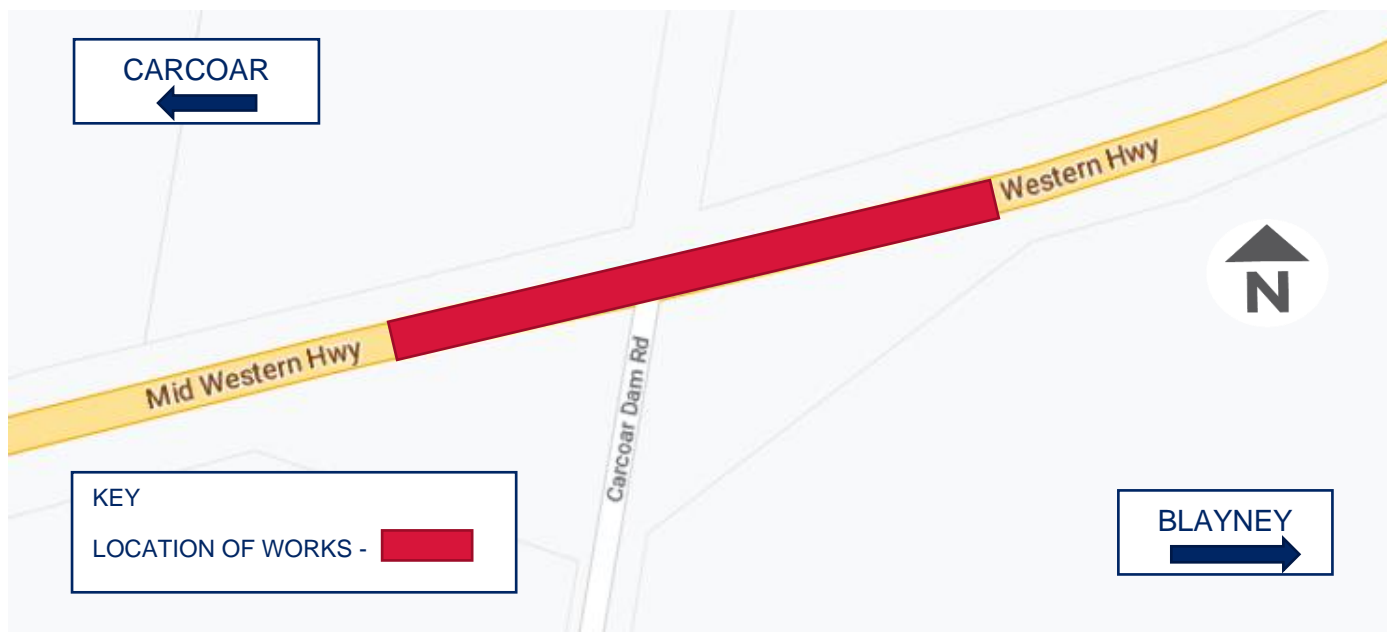
