

Temporary closure of Burns Road - update March 2023

What are we doing?

Burns Road has been temporarily closed to all through traffic at the intersection with Memorial Avenue since **September 2022**. The closure was required to allow services to be relocated, stormwater drainage to be installed and the new road to be built. Pedestrian access is being maintained during the closure.

We notified you in September 2022 that Burns Road was scheduled to reopen at the end of January 2023.

Unfortunately, we've encountered some unexpected delays due to ground conditions, which has delayed the reopening **until end of May 2023**. We understand that this delay may cause frustration, and we're doing everything we can to get the road reopened as soon as possible.

How will the work affect you?

Local traffic detours currently in place will remain during the during the closure.

People driving from Burns Road can access Windsor Road via Memorial Avenue using the following detour:

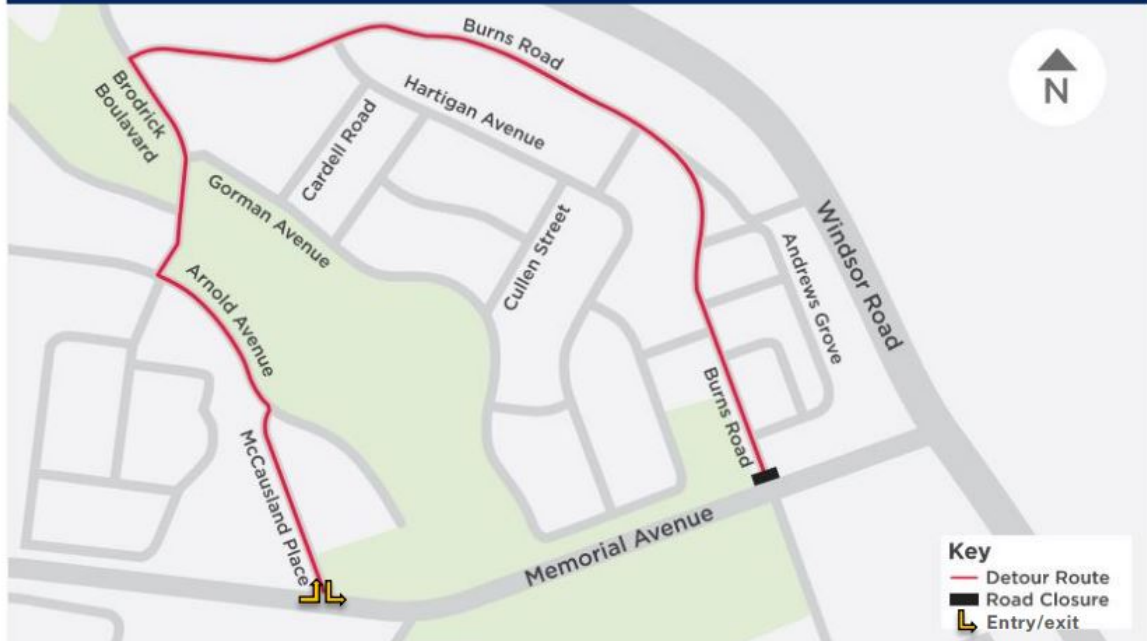
- Broderick Boulevard through to Arnold Avenue, McCausland Place and left into Memorial Avenue.
