



Work continuing on King Georges Road upgrade

Community update | February 2023

The Australian and NSW Governments are upgrading King Georges Road between Stoney Creek Road, Beverly Hills and Forest Road, Hurstville to improve safety, reduce congestion and improve journey times for road users.

What we are doing

From February to April 2023 work will include:

- Continuation of earthworks in northbound verge for road widening
- Continuation of utilities relocation and installation (Sydney Water, electrical, gas, sewer and communication)
- Continuation of stormwater drainage works
- Continuation of property adjustment works
- Commencement of asphaltting, kerb and gutter construction in Percival Street
- Continuation of pavement construction works
- Commencement of realignment of Sydney Water culvert at Clarence Street
- Commencement of construction of Variable Message Sign (VMS) in front of Beverly Hills Public School
- Commencement of Installation of 33kv electrical in Warwick Street
- Commencement of asphaltting, kerb and gutter construction in Warwick Street



Our schedule

From February to April 2023 our **night** work hours will be between **8pm and 5am** from **Sunday to Friday**. We will work a maximum of **five nights** per week. Our **day** work hours will be from **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday**, and **8am to 1pm** on **Saturdays**, weather and site conditions permitting. No work will take place on Sundays during the day, or on public holidays without prior notification.

How will the work affect you?

There will be noise and disruption associated with this work. We will make every effort to minimise impact to the local community and motorists in the area. This includes completing noisier activities, like saw-cutting and jack-hammering by midnight. Access to properties will be maintained at all times for local residents. Should there be a need to limit access at any time, residents will be notified in advance.

Asbestos monitoring

As the project progresses, asbestos may be discovered in the ground within the project area. If asbestos is identified, we will implement our Asbestos Management Plan, which details safe work practices, and ensures that all potential asbestos removal works are managed to strict Environment Protection Authority requirements.

Traffic changes

During our works, there will be an increase in traffic movements in and around the local streets, with temporary traffic changes and local road closures in place to ensure the work zone is safe.
