

Out of hours work for the installation of temporary roundabout in Kemps Creek

Transport for NSW acknowledge the Dharug people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pay respects to Elders past and present.

The Australian and NSW governments are building the M12 Motorway to provide direct access to the Western Sydney International Airport at Badgerys Creek and connect to Sydney's motorway network.

What work are we doing?

Transport for NSW have asked directly impacted residents and business owners about extending our night work to **five nights a week** for the installation of a temporary roundabout at the intersection of Elizabeth Drive and Devonshire Road in Kemps Creek in August 2023. We have received agreement from most of the residents to start work five nights a week. This means we can reduce the length of disruption.

This work will include:

- locating existing underground services
- lowering or protecting communications and power conduits
- using machinery to cut into the intersection, and widening it on the northern side
- widening the eastbound shoulder lane on Elizabeth Drive
- forming and pouring concrete
- installing new stormwater pipes and kerb
- laying new pavement out to around 60m west of Salisbury Avenue and 100m east of Devonshire Road
- restoring the area when all pavement and other work is complete.

When and where we'll be working

We will start work on the southern side of the Elizabeth Drive and Devonshire Road intersection between **8pm and 5am, Sunday to Thursday between Wednesday 25 October 2023 and Friday 22 December**. No work will take place on Friday and Saturday nights or public holidays.

This work needs to be carried out at night for the safety of our workers and road users and to minimise traffic disruption.

We will continue to move vehicles and materials to and from the construction compound at the northern end of Salisbury Avenue between **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**.

What equipment will be used?

During the work we may use excavators, concreting equipment, light and heavy vehicles, hand power tools, rollers, hand compaction tools, vacuum trucks, water carts, sweepers, milling machines, asphalt pavers, bobcats and lighting towers.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles in the area
- traffic controllers and signage
- lane closures and reduced speed limits
- pedestrian and cyclist detours with traffic controllers on site to guide you
- noise from plant and equipment.



Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community and the environment.

This includes:

- carrying out high impact work before midnight where possible
- turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use
- ensuring Salisbury Avenue is adequately maintained

- targeted lighting to minimise light spill
- monitoring noise so we can manage any potential impacts and adjust our work where possible.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes along the work zone during our work hours to ensure this area and traffic are safe.
