

# Marulan bypass pavement rehabilitation

## Project update - July 2022



#### **Project background**

The NSW government have provided a total of \$35 million to replace sections of the concrete pavement surface on the Hume Highway at Marulan.

The Marulan bypass, which was built in 1986 as part of the Hume Highway upgrade, is 7.5 kilometres long and is located about 31km north of Goulburn.

To improve driving conditions for motorists the existing concrete pavement will be replaced with a flexible pavement with a thick asphalt surface. The project will focus on repairing the pavement of sections of the southbound carriageway near Marulan.

### How will this work affect you?

Construction activities will be staged to minimise impacts on road users during construction, however there will some temporary impacts to allow us to safely carry out work.

There will be noise during construction as work will be carried out in continuous shifts from midnight on Sunday until midday on Friday. There will be no work during weekends, NSW and ACT public holidays and school holidays.

Contraflow arrangements, minor detours and reduced speed limits will be in place during work. Detours include temporary changes for access into and out of Highlands Way and temporary closures of the heavy vehicle safety station on the southbound carriageway.

Road users and nearby residents will be notified in advance of this work.


#### **Next steps**

The scope of work and approval documents for this project are being finalised and the project will be out to tender in the coming months.

An additional cross-over is being investigated for future maintenance work and to allow for contraflow arrangements during this project.

Further concrete slab replacement and asphalt repair work will be carried out on sections of the north and south bound lanes. This work is part of the overall scheduled maintenance in this area and is separate to the project.

Noise modelling and traffic counts will be carried out in the coming weeks to further understand impacts on road users and the community.
