The Newell Highway Program Alliance (NHPA) is excited to announce the completion of a 1.5 kilometre southbound overtaking lane on Wiradjuri Country, at Daroobalgie, about five kilometres north of Forbes.

The NHPA is jointly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments to deliver 38 overtaking lanes over four years on the Newell Highway.

The NHPA has now completed 31 overtaking lanes totalling more than 47 kilometres in length, since it started in early 2019.

The overtaking lanes will improve safety, reduce travel times and improve freight efficiency as part of the \$1.7 billion Newell highway upgrade.

The new overtaking lane at Daroobalgie included new pavement constructed across the full width of the highway. This approach will improve durability and reduce future maintenance costs.

Work on the Daroobalgie overtaking lane started in May 2022 and through effective traffic management measures, delays to motorists were reduced to less than five minutes during construction.


