



Night work - Traffic investigations for the Pacific Highway Upgrade, Wyong Town Centre

Transport for NSW will carry out traffic counts at Wyong to help with planning for the proposed upgrade of the Pacific Highway through Wyong town centre.

Tube counters and cameras will monitor traffic movements taking place between **Friday 25 August and Monday 4 September**, weather permitting. The findings of the investigations will provide Transport with a better understanding of traffic volumes, and pedestrian and cyclist movements in the proposed project area during special events and weekends.

On **Friday 25 August** and **Monday 4 September**, between **7pm** and **3am**, workers will park kerbside to install or remove tube counters at:

- Rose Street, on rail bridge
- Warner Street, east of Ithome Street
- Howarth Street south of Wyong Race Club access

On **Thursday 31 August** and **Friday 1 September**, between **7pm** and **3am**, workers will park kerbside to install or remove cameras at:

- Howarth Street and Railway bridge
- Howarth Street and Rose Street
- Rose Street car park
- Warner Avenue and Ithome Street
- Howarth Street and Warner Avenue
- Pacific Highway and Rose Street bridge

A map of survey locations has been provided below.

How will the work affect you?

There will be no traffic impacts while we install and remove cameras throughout the project area. The work will cause very minimal or no disruption to your property.

No noise will be generated, but you might notice workers in high vis clothing, using minimal lighting to carry out the work.
