

Work on the Great Western Highway at Kirkconnell from February 13

Construction of important safety upgrades will begin on a five kilometre section of the Great Western Highway at Kirkconnell, approximately 30 kilometres west of Lithgow

The first stage of the Kirkconnell rehabilitation and safety work will start on Monday February 13, near McManus Road. Work will include minor earthworks, drainage work and safety works. We have included a map that shows the location of work.

The work will be carried out from **Monday to Friday** between **7am to 5pm** and the project is expected to be complete in about **18 months**, weather permitting.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve machinery which generates noise. We will make every effort to minimise this by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

Traffic control and reduced speed limits of 40km/h and 60km/h will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Outside of work hours, the speed limit will be 80km/h. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work.
