

Work continuing at Medlow Bath from 1 April

Medlow Bath Upgrade

March 2024







Transport for NSW pays respect to the Darug and Gundungurra people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respects to Elders past and present.

The Medlow Bath Upgrade will reduce congestion and improve safety and accessibility for all road users, commuters, and pedestrians.

Transport for NSW is continuing work on the Great Western Highway from south of Bellevue Crescent to Station Street, and on Railway Parade Upgrade.

What work are we doing?

Construction activities over the **next six to eight weeks** will include:

- General earthworks across the site
- Constructing the retaining walls and fencing south of Bellevue Crescent
- Utility works on Railway Parade near Sheila Street and on Bellevue Crescent
- Installing drainage and asphalting along the Highway and Bellevue Crescent
- Installing line marking and signage on the Great Western Highway
- Installing a sewer main in Station Street
- Constructing the pedestrian bridge, stairs, lifts and station services.

When and where we'll be working

Work will continue from 1 April.

Day work hours are from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and Saturday from 8am to 4pm.

There will be some nightwork required for utilities and stormwater works and to carry out traffic switches on the Highway.

Nightwork hours will be between **6pm and 7am**, **Monday to Friday** for no more than two nights in a row, and no more than three nights in a week.

Affected residents will be notified about any upcoming night work dates.

We have included a map over the page to show the location of our work activities.

Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community and the environment and additional noise mitigation measures have been provided to help reduce the impact of the work. This includes:

- Maintaining access to properties at all times
- Maintaining pedestrian access
- Turning off machinery and vehicles not in use and arranging work in stages to minimise impacts to nearby residents
- Installing noise blankets around stationary equipment when possible
- Speaking with directly affected residents.

Traffic Impacts

Traffic control will be in place including stop/slow operations and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h. A detour will be in place on Railway Parade between 27 March and 29 March while we undertake pavement works in this area. This is shown in the map above.

Due to some delays in the utility works in Station Street, instead of the original date of early 2024, we now expect the street to reopen by mid-2024.
