## Adamstown, Kotara, Cockle Creek, Teralba, Booragul and Awaba Stations

January 2025



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

### The NSW Government is delivering new, state-of-the-art intercity and regional trains.

The new trains will provide new safety features, improved accessibility, facilities and reliability for passengers who travel on our regional and intercity networks.

To accommodate the new Regional Rail and Mariyung fleets, we need to upgrade and modify some existing rail infrastructure at various locations across the rail network.

### What work are we doing?

In January, work within the rail corridor includes:

- investigations for future signalling infrastructure
- installing car marker signs and posts
- removing redundant car marker signs and posts.

Equipment and machinery to be used:

- laser scanning and survey equipment
- vacuum truck
- hand tools including drills, bars, shovels, jackhammer, and concrete mixing tools.

### When and where we'll be working

During the week commencing **Thursday 2 January 2025**, we will be working at or around

**Adamstown, Kotara, Cockle Creek, Teralba, Booragul and Awaba** stations during standard construction hours of **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays**, weather permitting. There will be no work on public holidays.

### Out of hours work

To minimise disruption to the rail network and for the safety of staff and customers, some work is required to take place outside of standard construction hours, during scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork.

We will be working from **6am to 6pm on Saturday 4 January and Sunday 5 January 2025** to carry out the activities listed above.

### What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- moderate noise from construction activities.

### Managing our impacts

We will take steps to reduce noise and impacts on the community and the environment.

This includes and is not limited to:

- using non-tonal reversing beepers
- instructing workers to keep noise to a minimum, where possible.
