What is proposed?

Transport for NSW (Transport) is converting the Brookvale Bus Depot to zero emissions technology as part of the Zero Emission Buses Program. When complete, the depot will operate battery electric buses reducing operational impacts on our neighbours, delivering quieter streets, cleaner air and more comfortable journeys for passengers.

Planning Approval

A minor works Review of Environmental Factors (Minor Works REF) was prepared to assess the environmental and community impacts associated with the project.

When will work begin?

From Monday 8 July 2024, the depot operator, Keolis Downer, will commence work at the depot to support the new battery electric bus fleet, with the following activities planned:

- site establishment, including temporary laydown and compound facilities
- digging the foundations (piling) for the overhead recharging structures (gantries)
- concreting
- power supply upgrades
- installation of rooftop solar
- temporary parking of up to 20 buses at Westfield Warringah Mall while work is completed at the depot (subject to planning approval).

A range of equipment will be used during the work, including but not limited to:

- excavators
- vacuum trucks
- concrete saws
- concrete trucks
- piling rig (machine)
- jackhammers
- trucks
- directional drill rigs (machines)
- hand tools.

When and where we'll be working?

Construction work at the Brookvale Bus Depot will be completed during standard construction hours (Monday to Friday 7am-6pm and Saturdays 8am-1pm). Some work may be required outside of these hours and affected neighbours will be notified in advance of any work outside these times.

Off-site temporary bus parking is proposed to ensure there are no disruptions to bus services while this work is completed. Some buses may be temporarily parked in the Westfield Warringah Mall car park adjacent to Old Pittwater Road. Buses may be parked at this location 24 hours a day during construction.

What will this mean for you?

There will be some noise associated with the work activities. We will take every step to reduce noise and impacts on the community and the environment, this includes and is not limited to:

- using non-tonal reversing beepers
- instructing work to keep noise to a minimum
- not leaving machinery and equipment idling when not in use.

We will keep the community updated as construction progresses.

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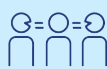
