

Nightwork on Great Western Highway on 16 and 17 December

Coxs River Road Upgrade

December 2024







Transport for NSW acknowledges people of the Wiradjuri Nation as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respects to Elders past and present.

The Coxs River Road upgrade will reduce congestion and improve safety and accessibility for all local and highway road users, commuters and pedestrians.

Transport for NSW's lead contractor, Ertech is continuing works at Little Hartley for the Coxs River Road Upgrade.

What work are we doing?

We will be undertaking some nightworks to allow us to begin connecting the new Great Western Highway to the existing road at the western end of the Upgrade.

During these nightworks we will be:

- removing barriers on the eastbound shoulder
- placing barriers close to the road centre line to shift traffic onto the eastbound shoulder and provide space for construction on the westbound side of the road.
- line marking
- installing temporary signage

When these works are finished, we will shift traffic onto the newly constructed eastbound section of road from near Mid Hartley Road to just west of Hartley Fresh.

When and where we'll be working

We will be working over two nights on 16 and 17 December between 7pm and 5am, weather permitting.

What will this mean for you?

Most of this work will have minimal impact on residents. However, you may notice:

- light from lighting towers
- noise from machinery and equipment
- plant movement in and out of the project site.

Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to minimise impacts to the community and the environment.

This includes:

- fencing work areas for safety and security
- controlling light spill to ensure it has minimal effect on properties
- reducing our noise as much as possible by working in stages and turning off machinery when not in use
- monitoring and maintaining our environmental controls during and after high rainfall events.
