The newly constructed eastbound bridge over Williams Creek will soon open to traffic. This comes two months after we opened another new bridge over the T8 Airport & South Line on Heathcote Road. This leap forward marks further significant progress on the Heathcote Road Upgrade this year, before it's completed in 2025.

Transitioning road users to new bridge

Road users will be directed onto the new eastbound Williams Creek Bridge during a traffic lane shift between Alec Campbell Drive and The Avenue starting on the 16 December 2024 (weather permitting).

Partial lane closures and traffic control measures will be in place to ensure the safety of workers and road users during the transition.

New Williams Creek eastbound bridge opening

The opening of the new eastbound Williams Creek Bridge is another leap forward for the Heathcote Road Upgrade.

The new bridge is 32 metres long and has new and improved features, such as a wide shared path for pedestrians and cyclists to use after the project's completion.

What the eastbound new bridge means for you

The new bridge has been built to withstand a 1 in 100 year flood event, making it safer and

better for the whole community to use. It's the second of five new bridges to open as part of the Heathcote Road Upgrade.

Once the project is finished, this new bridge will provide better access from southern Sydney to the Liverpool area with two traffic lanes and a new path for walkers and bike riders.

Managing our impacts

We may use noisy machinery and equipment as part of the night work including:

- generators/lighting towers
- street sweepers
- powered hand tools
- asphalt profiler and roller
- line marking equipment.

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community and the environment, including:

- separation of vehicle and pedestrian access
- turning off noisy machinery and vehicles when not in use
- escorting pedestrians through the work zone if necessary
- ensuring lighting is pointing away from properties
- keeping overall noise from the worksite to a minimum at all times
- making sure vehicles can move safely around construction areas
- implementing strategies to protect local wildlife, vegetation, and waterways, including measures to control erosion and manage sediment effectively
- continue to keep the community informed about what we're doing and listen to their concerns.
