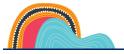


# **Community Notification**

# We are delivering new, state-of-the-art intercity and regional trains.

The new trains will provide new safety features, improved accessibility, facilities and reliability for passengers who travel on our regional and intercity networks.

To accommodate the new Regional Rail and Mariyung fleets, we need to upgrade and modify some existing rail infrastructure at various locations across the rail network.

# What work are we doing?

In November, work within the rail corridor includes:

- surveying and laser scanning of the station and rail corridor
- excavating to assess ground conditions and locate utilities including electrical assets and signalling infrastructure
- accessing pits within the rail corridor.

#### Equipment and machinery to be used:

- laser scanning and survey equipment
- vacuum truck
- excavator
- general hand tools
- electrical testing equipment.

# When and where we'll be working

From Monday 11 November 2024 we will be working at and around Junee Station during standard construction hours of 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays.

## Temporary parking reservation

From **5pm Friday 8 November until 6pm Wednesday 13 November 2024**, approximately 14 car spaces will be unavailable in the commuter car park at Junee Station. These spaces are required to enable investigation work to be carried out safely. During this time, please do not park in the shaded blue area shown in the map below.

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- · noise from investigation activities.

## Managing our impacts

We will take steps to reduce noise and impacts on the community and the environment.

This includes and is not limited to:

- using non-tonal reversing beepers
- instructing workers to keep noise to a minimum, where possible.
