Upcoming work activities

Some of our key activities you will see over the coming months include:

- installation of balustrades, utilities, lighting, deck elements, furniture, and roofing structures using a crawler crane, supported by a telehandler and electric hand tools, as part of the wharf fit-out
- work to complete the reinstatement of the Monument Track
- for wharf entrance work, we will install concrete pavement and furniture using concrete trucks and pumps
- placement of topsoil and landscaping elements using hand tools and excavators.
- connection of water and electrical services from the end of the wharf to the corner of Captain Cook Drive and Prince Charles Parade
- installation of a new National Parks and Wildlife Service signage wall near the start of the Monument Track
- testing and checks (called commissioning) of the new structures and equipment, including nighttime testing of new wharf lighting
- removal of construction materials, equipment and site buildings as certain work activities are completed
- changing our construction areas and fencing, including making our maritime exclusion zone area smaller.

All work activities and dates are subject to weather and site conditions.

Work hours update

A reminder that our current work hours include:

- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday: standard construction activities
- 8am to 1pm, Saturdays: standard construction activities
- 1pm to 6pm, Saturdays: low impact construction activities only, until the end of September (we don't anticipate that these activities will be very noisy).

The low impact activities may include:

- using hand tools to complete the wharf fit-out and install wharf furniture
- limited movement of cranes and excavators
- using boats
- divers near the wharf.

The safety of the community and our workers is our highest priority. Please continue to stay outside of our construction zones on land and water. The sites are closely monitored by security staff and cameras.


Managing our impacts
