


Community Notification

Lidcombe Station

February 2024







Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

We are delivering a new, state-of-theart fleet of intercity trains called the Mariyung.

The new trains will provide a new level of comfort and convenience for the thousands of customers who travel between Sydney and the Central Coast, Newcastle, the Blue Mountains and the South Coast.

To accommodate the new Mariyung fleet, we need to modify some existing rail infrastructure at various locations across the rail network.

What work are we doing?

From Tuesday 27 February, we will be carrying out investigation work at Lidcombe Station. This will include:

- establishment of a temporary site compound for the storage of plant and equipment and portable amenities
- surveying the station platform
- borehole drilling, to a minimum of six metres in depth, in multiple locations to determine ground conditions
- inspections of in-ground electrical pits
- assessing electrical infrastructure such as switchboards and existing light poles.

Equipment and machinery to be used, but not limited to:

- laser scan for surveying
- mobile drill rig
- vacuum truck
- excavator
- front end loader
- hand tools.

When and where we'll be working

From Tuesday 27 February, we will be working inside the rail corridor at Lidcombe Station, near Church Street, during standard construction hours of **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm Saturday**.

To minimise disruption to the rail network and for the safety of staff and customers, some work has been scheduled to take place during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork period, weather permitting.

This includes:

- 6am to 6pm, Saturday 2 March
- 6am to 6pm, Sunday 3 March

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- traffic controllers
- noise from construction activities.

Managing our impacts

We will take steps to reduce noise and impacts on the community and the environment. This includes and is not limited to:

- using non-tonal reversing beepers
- instructing workers to keep noise to a minimum.
