

Weekend work on pedestrian bridge from 18 May

Medlow Bath Upgrade

Transport for NSW pays respect to the Darug and Gundungurra people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respects to Elders past and present.

The Medlow Bath Upgrade will reduce congestion and improve safety and accessibility for all road users, commuters, and pedestrians.

What work are we doing?

Construction is progressing on the new pedestrian bridge at Medlow Bath Station.

We are timing our next stage of work to align with a planned Sydney Trains possession weekend on 18 and 19 May. No train services will operate during this time.

Work on the station platform will include:

- using a large crane on Railway Parade to install precast elements within the railway corridor
- installing stair handrails
- platform resurfacing works
- continued work on lift 1, including upper/lower canopies, brick laying, removing scaffolding, and installing down pipes
- installing platform light poles
- forming embankments
- installing temporary bridge support and services.

When and where we'll be working

Work will align with the Sydney Trains rail possession from 12am Saturday 18 May to 2am Monday 20 May.

We have included a map over the page to show the location of work activities.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- an increase in plant, vehicle, and truck movements in the area
- work activity on the railway platform and surrounding areas
- signage and traffic impacts along Railway Parade.

Pedestrian access will be maintained along Railway Parade to Medlow Park, Potbelly Café, and the station. Please follow signage and the marked path for your safety.


Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community and the environment. This includes:

- providing a pedestrian pathway along Railway Parade
- turning off machinery when not in use
- always maintaining access to properties
- liaising directly with affected residents and businesses prior to work commencing
- arranging work in stages at different locations
- traffic control to maintain and direct vehicle movements.

Traffic Impacts

Traffic management will be in place along Railway Parade from **5am on Saturday 18 May until 6pm on Sunday 19 May** as a large crane will be positioned adjacent to the Potbelly Café.

Traffic control and signage will be in place, including a reduced speed limit of 40km/h.

Road users, including pedestrians and school children, are advised to follow the directions of signs and traffic control. For traffic updates, call 132 701, download the Live Traffic NSW App or visit livetraffic.com.
