Item 2: Safety Campaigns: trends and outcomes

DL

- Boating season 2024/25 campaigns: 2 Domestic Commercial Vessel, 3 Statewide (Sept 2024, January 2025, April 2025); 5 Regional.
- 28-29 Sept Statewide campaign: Total 861 vessel safety checks conducted: 59 Informal warnings; 94 official cautions, 48 penalty notices.
- 2-3 Nov South region campaign: Total 363 vessel safety checks; 6 informal warnings 26 official cautions, 17 penalty notices.
- NSW Smart Waterway Program underway. Safety boating through technology.

• Marine Safety Amendment Bill 2024: The NSW Minister for Transport introduced the Marine Safety Amendment Bill 2024 on 18 September 2024 to amend the Marine Safety Act 1998. The proposed amendments aim to improve, update and streamline NSW's marine safety laws.

Item 5: Maritime Infrastructure Delivery Office DC

- Kamay Ferry Wharves (La Perouse to Kurnell) Due for completion early 2025. Asbestos find delayed project close out.
- Inner City Sewer Pump Out Initial Rozelle Bay location not proceeding due to unknown development future of site. Investigation of an upgrade to King St wharf underway.
- Balls Head Waverton (Northern Access and Mooring Upgrade) Design and approvals underway. Target completion Q1 2025.
- Wharves Walsh Bay (No. 10 east and west), Bayview Park and Kirribilli wharves currently closed due to safety concerns. Works scheduled for completion by FY 24/25.
- Tuncurry Boat Maintenance Facility Design and approvals underway. Construction due to start mid 2025. Project funding approved.
- Crowdy Head Harbour Upgrade Design and approvals complete. Construction targeted Q2 2025 – Q2 2026.
- Port Macquarie Breakwater Upgrade On hold.
- Swansea Breakwall \$3m funding approved. Construction to start mid-late 2025.

- Coffs Harbour Unleaded refuelling facility and boat ramp projects complete and open since March 2024. Coffs Harbour boat ramp and unleaded refuelling facility open to public.
- Brunswick Head Harbour Harbour upgrade on hold. Funding approved for utility upgrade including sewer pump out. Work to commence mid 2025.
- Snug Cove Maritime Precinct (Eden) Maritime pursuing a federal grant to construct a marina, facilities, and public domain. Design and approvals underway.
- Narooma Wharf Upgrade Design and approvals complete. Project on hold pending funding.

Item 7: NSW Mooring Action Plan

RD

- **NSW Mooring Action Plan**: The Mooring Action Plan (MAP) is a new and expanded agenda for the improved management of boat moorings in NSW. The MAP replaces the Mooring Reform Program (MRP) and responds to strategic and operational priorities and reflects the reforms that have occurred as well as well as new and emerging issues.
- Recent updates sent to mooring licensees: Transport conducts a review of environmental factors when approving changes to moorings. Approximately 14% of active moorings sites are located within 10m of culturally or environmentally sensitive areas. Mooring licensees with identified sites in the South region were recently sent a letter advising them to contact Transport prior to making any changes to their moorings, vessels or licences as changes will be subject to assessment and relocation may be required. Letters will be sent to affected mooring licensees in the Greater Sydney and North regions in the next month. A flyer will be included in annual licence renewals.
