



# Sefton Park Infrastructure Upgrade

## More Trains, More Services

March to May 2024



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Darug people of the Eora Nation as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The More Trains, More Services program is simplifying and modernising the rail network. Passengers will be able to access more services on a simpler and more reliable network through the delivery of better infrastructure, new trains and extra services.

### What work are we doing?

Between March and May 2024, work includes:

- site survey and investigation work for future planning of construction, environment and safety controls
- installation of new signalling cables and removal of redundant cables
- overhead wiring adjustment work
- track modifications
- equipment and material deliveries.

### When and where we'll be working

Between March and May 2024, work will be undertaken in and adjacent to the rail corridor at Sefton Park.

Standard construction hours on this project are between **7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am and 1pm on Saturdays.**

### Out of hours work

Between March and May 2024, some work is required to take place outside of construction hours, we will be working from:

- **6pm Friday 22 March and 7am Monday 25 March**
- **6pm Friday 12 April and 7am Monday 15 April**
- **6pm Friday 19 April and 7am Monday 22 April 2024.**

### Why we work outside of standard construction hours

We schedule work outside of standard construction hours to take place during Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running, minimising disruptions to commuter services and improving the safety of our construction team and customers.

### What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- increased number of workers and vehicles travelling along Wellington Road, Auburn Road, Carlingford Road, Tewinga Road, Bagdad Street and Hope Street
- lighting from temporary lighting towers
- moderate noise from machinery and equipment
- security cameras and motion sensors installed to assist in monitoring, managing and prevention of unlawful activity inside and adjacent to the rail corridor.



## Managing our impacts

We understand construction activities may cause disruption to our closest neighbours, and every effort will be made to minimise the impacts where possible, including:

- turning off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing alarms to reduce potential noise impacts to the surrounding community

- locating equipment as far away from residents and businesses as possible
- directing lighting away from residents
- conducting on site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.
