

South Mosman Wharf Upgrade

Night work in November and December



October 2024

South Mosman Wharf is being upgraded as part of the Safe Accessible Transport program to make public transport safe, inclusive and easy to use for all passengers, especially people with disability, older people, people with prams or luggage and people with limited mobility.

Upcoming night work

Over the next few weeks, the new pontoon, gangway, stairs and roof structures for the new wharf will be brought in by boat and installed. We will also be installing the last of the new pontoon piles, which will support the new wharf and make docking for boats easier and safer.

For safety and accuracy, this work needs to be carried out at night when the water is at its calmest and there is less marine traffic.

When we'll be working

Work will take place over **eight nights** from **Wednesday 6 November to Sunday 8 December** (excluding Saturdays), **8pm to 5am**, weather and maritime conditions permitting. We understand night work can be disruptive. To provide residents with a break from the noise, we will work two consecutive night shifts followed by a five-night break.

Our other construction activities will continue during standard work hours from **7am to 5pm**.

What the work involves

Work involves:

- Transporting to site, lifting and screwing in the new pontoon piles
- Transporting to site and installing the stairs, roof structures, new wharf pontoon and gangway.

Equipment to be used include a barge crane, tugboat, specialised equipment to attach to the crane to enable the piles to be installed, small open work boat (like a “tinny”), temporary lighting and hand tools. Pedestrian and vehicle access will be maintained to properties along Musgrave Street.

Managing our impacts

To minimise impacts we will be turning off equipment when not in use and placing equipment and lights as far away as possible from residents. The piles will be lowered into place and screwed into the seabed. If any hammering is required, this will only be carried out after 7am.
