Sydney Harbour Bridge

From Sunday 8 December to Friday 20 December 2024

What we're doing

Sydney Trains is replacing the timber deck supporting the track on the Sydney Harbour Bridge with a concrete composite deck. The work is being completed in stages during scheduled weeknight and weekend rail closedowns. The new deck will strengthen the structure, extend the life of the rail corridor, simplify track maintenance and, when complete, reduce train noise for nearby residents.

Work activities include prep work for the permanent removal of the Sydney Harbour Bridge deck scaffold which is due to commence 14 January 2025. Areas that will be affected during this work will be Dawes Point Park, George Street and Cumberland Street.

How this affects you

Noise

- These works will create additional noise at nights.
- **Work will take place during the following times:**
 - **6pm to 5am Sunday 8 December to Friday 13 December**
 - **6pm to 5am Sunday 15 December to Friday 20 December.**
- Trucks will be used during this time to transport scaffolding from Dawes Point Park/George Street/Cumberland Street by Lower Fort Street.
- We will select low-noise equipment when available.

Traffic and Parking

- Heavy vehicles will use local streets to access the rail corridor. Parking will be limited near access gates.
- We will park our vehicles inside the rail corridor where possible, however please be aware that on-street parking may be limited near worksites.
- Traffic controllers will be on duty to assist motorists and pedestrians throughout the duration of the works.

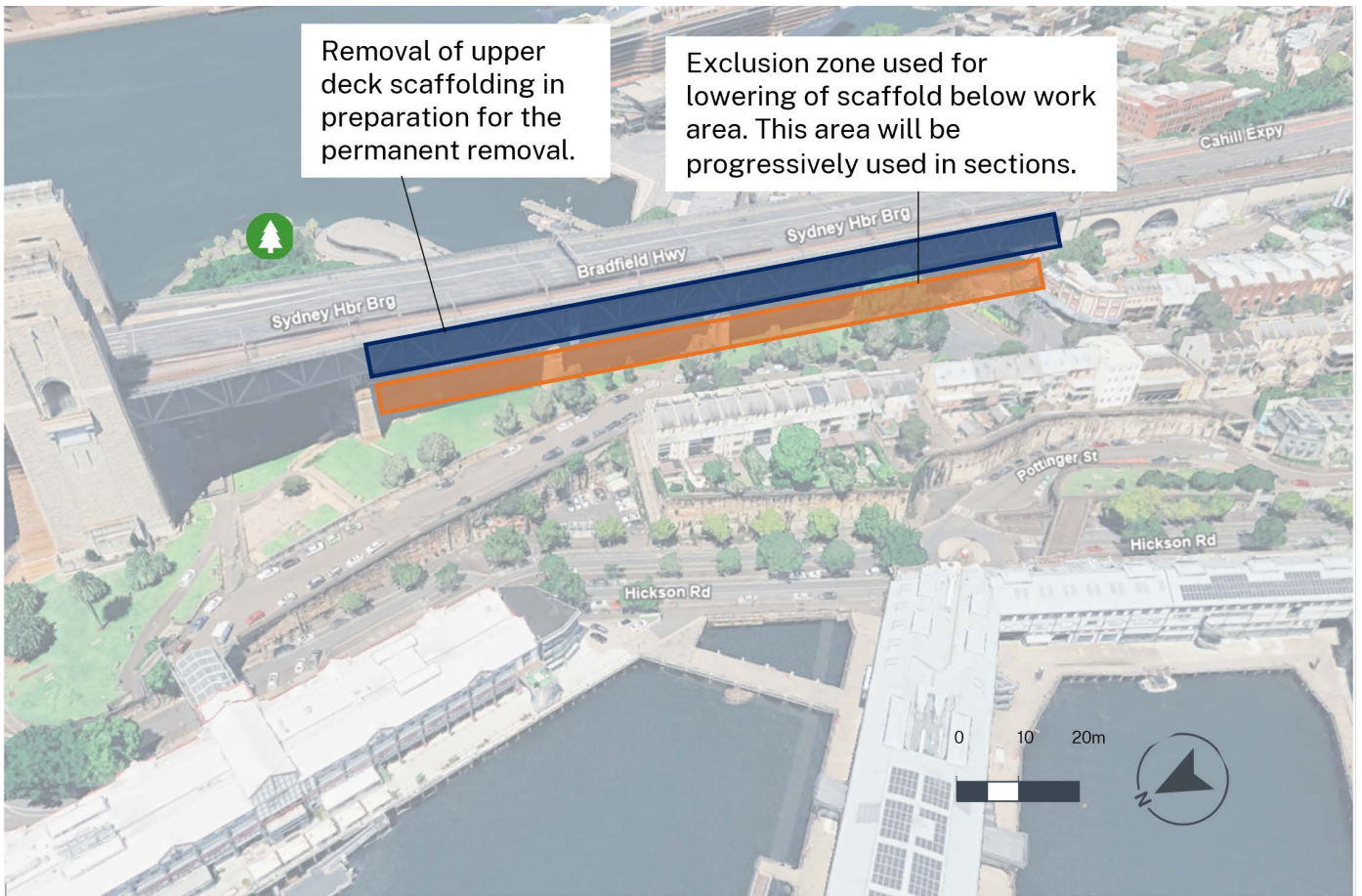
