



Construction update

Sydney Harbour Bridge Cycleway Ramp

December 2024 and January 2025



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Cammeraygal people of the Eora Nation as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is delivering a new bike ramp and cycle path from the Sydney Harbour Bridge cycleway to the bike network in Milsons Point. The project will improve the cycling experience for all bike users at this iconic landmark and support the predicted future growth in the number of bike riders travelling north and south of the Sydney Harbour Bridge.

Upcoming work

Work onsite during January 2025 will include:

- relocating and installing services in preparation for the eight ramp columns
- preparing to install the eight ramp columns including excavating and pouring the concrete molds for the foundations holes
- leveling and shaping the ground where the cycle ramp will land in Bradfield Park North
- removing garden beds and vegetation near the entrance to Milsons Point Station.

Where required, temporary fencing will be installed around the work sites. Pedestrian access to Milsons Point station will be maintained at all times.

Holiday period shutdown

We'll be closing for the holiday period from 5pm **Friday 20 December 2024. Work onsite will restart 7am Monday 6 January 2025.**

During this time no construction activities will be carried out, and the site compounds will be locked and secured.

Sustainability initiatives

We are committed to delivering the project as sustainably as possible. This includes being energy and water efficient, recycling and reusing goods and materials.

Two initiatives the team have recently achieved include:

- working with Taronga Zoo and WILD LIFE Sydney Zoo to collect branches from trees removed in November. The foliage provided additional food and habitat for the zoo's animals including Kofi the tree Kangaroo pictured below
- Operating the site compound on 100% GreenPower renewable energy
- installing a rainwater tank for use on site.

Acknowledgement of Country

Representatives from the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council performed an Acknowledgement of Country and traditional Aboriginal Smoking Ceremony in the site compound on Friday 29 November 2024 to mark the start of main works on this site.

A smoking ceremony is a traditional custom among First Nations people, which involves smoldering native plants to produce smoke. The smoke produced from the plants has the ability to have both spiritual and physical cleansing properties in addition to warding off bad spirits and negative energy.



When we'll be working

Standard construction hours are:

- 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday
- 8am to 1pm on Saturday

No work will be carried out on Sundays or public holidays.

Work will be carried out during the day wherever possible, however, some work will be required outside of these hours to minimise impacts to local traffic and so we can work safely next to the rail corridor.

Impacted residents will be notified of work outside of standard construction hours before we start.
