21 June 2024

Works across Sydney's road and transport network

Motorists are advised of changed traffic conditions across Greater Sydney for maintenance and project works.

Sydney Harbour Bridge

Up to five lanes on the Sydney Harbour Bridge deck will close for maintenance and upgrade works from tonight:

- Friday 21 June: 10.30pm 6am (up to five lanes)
- Saturday 22 June: 11pm 4.30am (up to five lanes)
- Sunday 23 June: 10pm 4.30am (five lanes)
- Monday 24 June: 11.30pm 2am (two lanes)
- Tuesday 25 June: 10pm 4.30am (one lane)
- Wednesday 26 June: 10pm 4.30am (five lanes)
- Thursday 27 June: 10pm 4.30am (up to five lanes)

Motorists can use other lanes on the Sydney Harbour Bridge or drive through the Sydney Harbour Tunnel as an alternative route (though see below for Sydney Harbour Tunnel closures).

Sydney Harbour Tunnel / Domain Tunnel

Planned maintenance work means the Sydney Harbour Tunnel and the Domain Tunnel will be closed at the following times:

- Both <u>northbound</u> lanes will be closed Tuesday 25 June from 1.30am 5am <u>and</u> from 11.30pm until 5am on Wednesday 26 June.
- Both <u>southbound</u> lanes will be closed from 11.30pm 5am on both Monday 24 June and Tuesday 25 June.

Eastern Distributor

Planned maintenance work means the Eastern Distributor will be closed at the following times:

- Northbound: 10.30pm 5am on both Monday 24 June and Tuesday 25 June.
- Southbound: 11pm 5am on both Monday 24 June and Tuesday 25 June.

Western Distributor

Southbound Western Distributor lanes between Market Street and Harbour Street will be closed on Sunday 23 June, Monday 24 June, Tuesday 25 June and Wednesday 26 June between 9pm and 5am.

Motorists travelling from Sydney Harbour Bridge to Anzac Bridge will be detoured via Harbour Street, Pier Street, William Henry Street, Wattle Street, Pyrmont Bridge Road and Western Distributor. Motorists travelling on Market Street to Anzac Bridge will be detoured to the Druitt Street on-ramp via Sussex Street. Details of the detours are here.

Warringah Freeway Upgrade

Motorists are advised of changed traffic conditions on the Warringah Freeway from this weekend.

From 8pm Friday 21 June to 4.30am Monday 24 June, the High Street southbound onramp to the Cahill Expressway will be closed in North Sydney. Alternative southbound on-ramp access to the expressway will be via High Street, Arthur Street and Mount Street southbound on-ramp.

There will also be a contraflow arrangement in place on High Street, North Sydney between Clark Road and Alfred Street North, with one eastbound and one westbound lane available to motorists.

From 10pm Friday 21 June to 4.30am Saturday 22 June, the Brook Street northbound off-ramp in Crows Nest will be closed. Alternative northbound off-ramp access will be via Willoughby Road. Motorists are advised to plan ahead and allow for extra travel time.

M6 Stage 1

Utility and road upgrades will be required on President Avenue in Kogarah between West Botany Street and O'Connell Street, from 8pm, Friday 21 June until 5am, Monday 24 June. Major traffic changes will be in place along President Avenue. Residential access will be maintained at all times. Motorists should expect delays. Details are here.

M7 Motorway upcoming works

The southbound M7 Motorway ramps to and from Elizabeth Drive, Cecil Hills will be closed for bridge foundation work from 8pm Friday to 5am Monday over the following weekends:

- Friday 21 June to Monday 24 June: M7 southbound off-ramp from Elizabeth Drive
- Friday 28 June to Monday 1 July: M7 southbound on-ramp to Elizabeth Drive
- Friday 5 July to Monday 8 July: M7 southbound off-ramp to Elizabeth Drive

Essential trackwork

Passengers are urged to plan ahead this weekend, 22-23 June, as essential Rail Repair Plan trackwork continues to build a more resilient and reliable network.

Buses will replace trains due to planned trackwork on key sections of the T4 Eastern Suburbs & Illawarra Line, as well as intercity services on the South Coast Line.

Light Rail

Due to ongoing industrial action, all L1 Dulwich Hill Line, L2 Randwick Line and L3 Kingsford Line light rail services will run at a reduced frequency daily until further notice. Use the <u>Trip Planner</u> for alternative transport options or find more information <u>here</u>.
