# Temporary causeway removal and electrical connection work - Kurnell

#### March 2024



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gweagal and Bidjigal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

This notification provides an update on our key upcoming work activities at Kurnell.

The activities in this notification will take place within our normal daytime hours **7am to 6pm**, **Monday to Friday** and **8am to 6pm on Saturdays**.

All work activities and dates are subject to weather and site conditions.

## Temporary causeway removal

- From early April, we'll start work to remove the rock material that was used to build the temporary causeway.
- The causeway was built as a temporary structure to help construct the wharf. Work in this area is complete and it is no longer needed.
- The temporary steel jetty structure, which connects to the causeway, is also being removed as part of our general construction work.

#### You may notice:

- trucks collecting up to approximately 10 loads of rock per day, for around a **two-week period**
- trucks driving directly into the construction site (they will not queue outside the site, and we don't anticipate any impacts to traffic flow or car parking).

#### During our work we will:

- carefully remove each section of the temporary causeway and associated material
- carry out our work in line with the Construction Environmental Management Plan and sub-plans
- carry out routine water quality and noise monitoring during removal of the causeway rock.

## Electrical connection work

- As part of our work to connect the wharf to permanent power, we will install a new power pole **from early April**. We anticipate this will take around **one day** to complete.
- From late April, we will then install an aerial (overhead) electrical wire across the road near the corner of Captain Cook Drive and Prince Charles Parade to connect into the new pole. We anticipate this work will take around **one hour** to complete.
- The electrical wire connection work area is shown in orange on the map over the page.
- Within the construction site, we are also continuing our work to install underground electrical cables to the wharf.


#### You may notice:

- equipment including a bucket truck and support vehicle being used during the work
- safety measures such as signs and traffic controls in place for the duration of the electrical connection work.

#### During our work:

- we don't anticipate any impacts to the general electricity supply
- we will manage traffic safety with stop-go traffic controls on the corner of Captain Cook Drive and Prince Charles Parade
- we will keep the footpath open to pedestrians
- we will not impact car parking spaces, the bus stop and bus services.
