

Mount Ousley interchange

Upcoming closures of the M1 Princes Motorway,
Mount Ousley Road and Picton Road

August 2024



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

We are building a new interchange on the M1 Princes Motorway at the base of Mount Ousley to improve connectivity, safety and efficiency for those travelling through the gateway to Wollongong.

What work we are doing?

Our first multiple night closures of the M1 Princes Motorway, Mount Ousley Road at the intersection with the M1 and Picton Road will occur in August 2024, between 8pm and 4am on:

- **Sunday 18 August, Monday 19 August and Wednesday 21 August**
- **Sunday 25 August, Monday 26 August and Wednesday 28 August.**

Should these full road closures not occur due to weather, they will be rescheduled for the following fortnight.

During the closure we will be removing vegetation, installing barriers and signs, building site access gates, removing part of the southbound noise wall and installing a temporary noise wall, completing drainage work, relocating utilities, installing temporary street lighting and carrying out pavement work and linemarking.

During these closures Transport for NSW will also be carrying out maintenance work on the M1 Princes Motorway between Bulli Tops and Memorial Drive, and on Picton Road between the M1 Princes Motorway and Almond Street at Wilton. Work will include vegetation removal, guardrail repairs, pavement testing, line marking and cleaning drains to improve safety.

How will this work affect you?

There will be some noise and lighting associated with this work. Equipment will include light vehicles and trucks, vacuum trucks, lighting towers, generators, excavators with hammers and chainsaws, rollers and graders, compaction equipment, road profiler and saw, asphalt paver and spray seal truck, concreting equipment, linemarking truck, chainsaws and mulchers, and cranes.

We will make every effort to minimise noise and complete this work as quickly as possible.

Traffic impacts

During full closures of the M1 Princes Motorway, Mount Ousley Road at the intersection with the M1 and Picton Road, detours will be in place.

- Light and heavy vehicles less than 19 metres long and under 50 tonnes, travelling between Wollongong and Bulli Tops can detour via Memorial Drive and Bulli Pass.
- Heavy vehicles over 19 metres long and more than 50 tonnes will not be able to access Bulli Pass and are advised to delay their journey.
- Road users travelling between Wollongong and the Hume Motorway can detour via Memorial Drive, Bulli Pass, Appin Road, or the Illawarra Highway (Macquarie Pass).
- Light vehicles can also detour via Wilton Road (Broughton Pass).

Electronic message signs will advertise road closure dates in advance and any changes to dates due to weather impacts.

Access window for heavy vehicles over 19 metres long and more than 50 tonnes

Heavy vehicles over 19 metres long and more than 50 tonnes, will be given a 30-minute window of access during the full closures on:

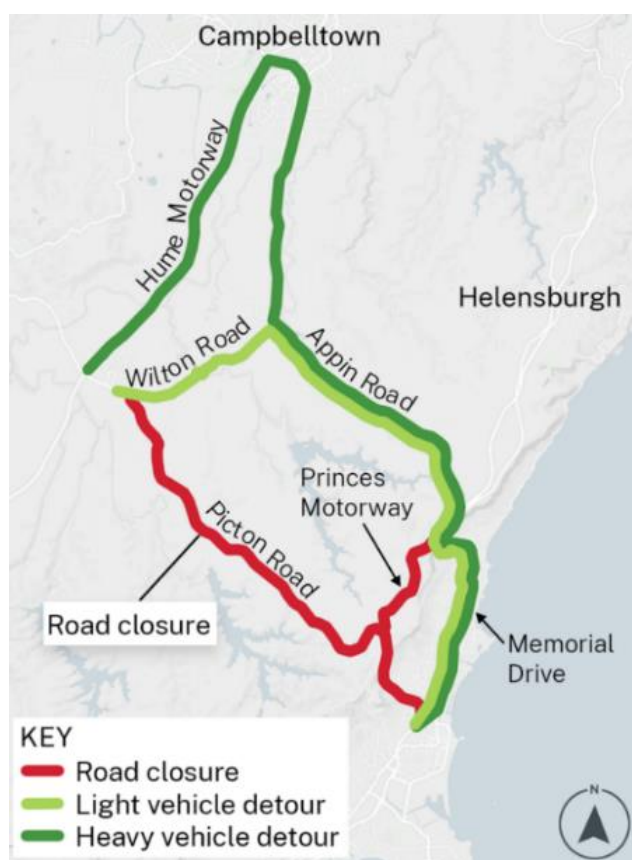
- **Monday 19 August** and **Wednesday 21 August**
- **Monday 26 August** and **Wednesday 28 August**

Vehicles who register in advance will be escorted through the site at 12am.
