## What work are we doing?

Our work activities will involve:

- installing temporary traffic control, signs and safety barriers
- removing trees and vegetation within work areas
- building temporary road surfaces and access gates
- delivering, using and removing equipment as needed.

We will work over **seven nights** in total, with a maximum of **three nights** per week from **Thursday 5 December** to **Friday 13 December**, weather and work program permitting.

Our work hours are between **6pm** and **5am**.  
Additional night works may be required following the indicated period in this notification.

We will endeavour to minimise disruption and residents directly impacted will be notified.

## How will this work affect you?

Work may be noisy at times, but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including turning off equipment and machinery when not in use.

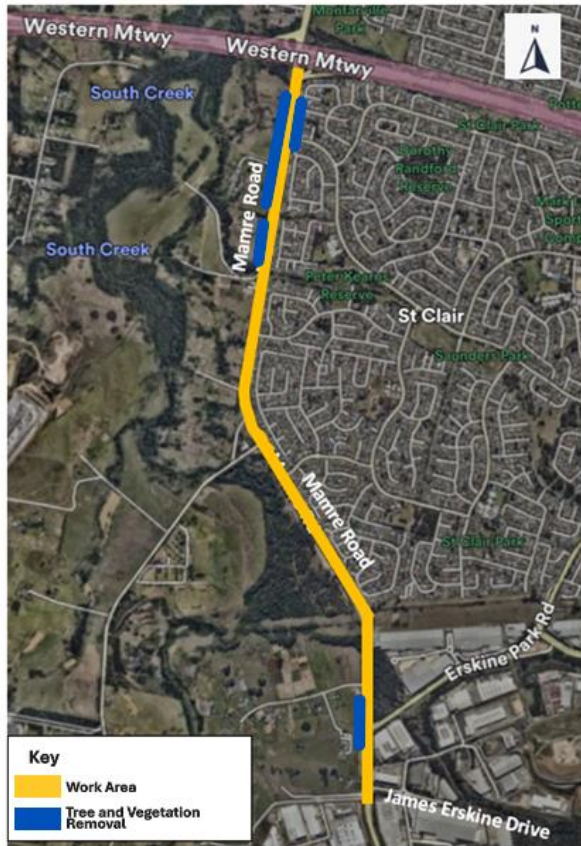
## Traffic changes
