

# Nightwork for essential pavement maintenance on the Newell Highway in Dubbo from Sunday 11 August

# Transport for NSW is carrying out essential maintenance work on the Newell Highway in Dubbo.

# What work are we doing?

The work will include asphalting to repair the damaged road surface on Erskine Street, between Darling Street and east of Bourke Street. We have included a map to show the location of our work area.

# When we'll be working

We will be working between **7pm** and **5am Sunday to Friday,** from **Sunday 11 August.** We expect to complete the work in **four nights.** 

All work activities and dates are subject to weather and site conditions.

# What will this mean for you?

There may be temporary impacts to vehicle and pedestrian access while the work is carried out. Please ensure vehicles are parked off-street prior to the commencement of work at 7pm each night for the four-night duration of the works.

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe. The **road will remain open with single lane closures and a 40km/h speed limit** in place during work hours which may affect travel times. The speed limit will return to the posted speed limit outside of

work hours. Motorists should allow up to **five minutes** extra travel time.

# There may also be light vehicle local road detours in place during work hours.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

# Detour for heavy vehicles

There will be a detour in place for heavy vehicles for **two night shifts**, **on 13 and 14 August**.

Heavy vehicles need to detour via Whylandra Street/Thompson Street/Mitchell Highway (Narromine Road)/ Bunglegumbie Road/Troy Bridge Road. Motorists should allow for **20 minutes extra travel time**.

We have included a map to show the detour route for heavy vehicles.


# Managing our impacts
