Appin Road and St Johns Road Intersection Upgrade

Transport for NSW (Transport) plans to improve the intersection of Appin Road and St Johns Road in Bradbury.

This work will improve safety and reduce delays, so the intersection continues to meet the needs of the community as the area grows.

We invite the community to provide feedback on the Review of Environmental Factors (REF) which will be on display from Sunday 20 July to Sunday 10 August.

Appin Road is a major arterial road supporting travel to and from the south-west Sydney region and Wollongong area. It also plays a key role in connecting the township of Appin to employment, education, and services in larger areas such as Campbelltown and Wollongong.

Project background



Why we want to upgrade the intersection

Appin Road will continue to be an important connection for communities as more people move into the area. Upgrading the intersection now will ensure the road network performs into the future improving journey reliability and road safety. This project also compliments other road safety improvements occurring along Appin Road.

General intersection improvements

- Pavement work on Appin Road and St Johns Road
- New southbound on road cycling in the shoulder lane at the Appin Road and St Johns Road intersection
- New footpaths, kerbs and gutters, street lighting, landscaping, line marking and signage
- Improvements to existing utility services (water, power, communications) and installation of new services.

Multiple site compounds are proposed to be used during construction. This includes three preferred sites (one on Dickens Road and two on Copperfield Drive). Two additional sites are being considered in Flynn Reserve and Woodland Road Reserve off Woodland Road. All site compounds will be restored when the intersection upgrade is completed.

Subject to planning approval, construction is expected to start in 2026 and take around 12 months to complete.

Koalas were not recorded in the project area during surveys and biodiversity assessments. Potential impacts to koalas are expected to be minor due to limited habitat present in the construction area and isolation from known habitat corridors along Spring Creek and the Nepean River. The project is not likely to significantly impact threatened species or ecological communities or their habitats.

Protection measures including pre-clearing surveys and pre-work inspections will occur to eliminate the risk of koalas being inadvertently injured during construction work.

Transport will prepare and implement a Tree and Hollow Replacement Plan to support a healthy environment, protect wildlife and make up for the loss in street trees.

Environmental consideration

The Greater Macarthur (39,000 homes) and Wilton Growth Areas (15,000 homes) are continuing to grow with homes planned to be delivered over the next 20 years in new urban renewal precincts.

At the heart of these growth areas will be protected koala habitat featuring interconnected green corridors, a new koala national park along the Georges River, and new public infrastructure with safeguards to protect the koala population in south-west Sydney.

The NSW Government is implementing various measures to enhance protection measures for koalas and other wildlife by building crossings, constructing fencing around key roads, and improving signage for road users passing through these areas.

The upgrade of the intersection will require the removal of trees. This includes 16 small trees, 65 medium trees and 12 large trees. Four trees are hollow-bearing trees, with two trees listed as koala feed trees and 82 listed as koala use trees.

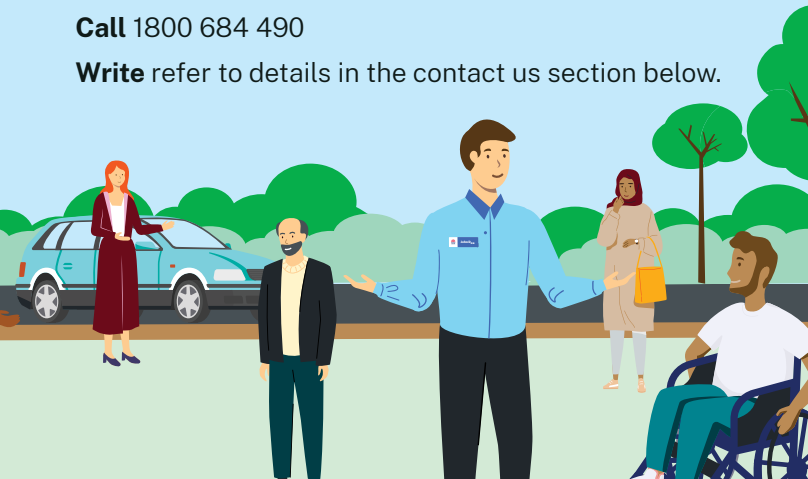

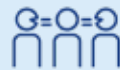
