



Slope remediation work on Bells Line of Road, between Bell and Mount Tomah from 14 January 2025

Community Notification

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Darug Peoples as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pay respects to Elders past and present people of the Blue Mountains.

Transport for NSW (Transport) is carrying out pavement and slope repair work to strengthen the Bells Line of Road.

Transport will stabilise a slope damaged by adverse weather in 2022 on the Bells Line of Road approximately 3.5 kilometres east of the intersection of Bells Line of Road and the Darling Causeway at Bell.

As part of this work we will permanently close the road shoulder and install safety barriers.

What work are we doing?

We will be:

- installing safety barriers
- clearing vegetation where needed
- excavating and closing the shoulder
- drilling and installing mini piles, to stabilise the roadway
- replacing around 360 square metres of pavement
- replacing the steel guardrail
- reconstructing around 100 metres of drainage
- installing new line marking.

When we'll be working

We'll be working for 25 weeks between **14 January and 30 June 2025**, weather permitting.

Working hours will be **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, and 8am to 1pm on Saturday.**

We will need to do some nightwork, with work hours from **8pm to 5am**. We will notify impacted stakeholders when these works are going to take place.

We will not work on Sundays or public holidays.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- traffic signage
- traffic controllers to guide heavy vehicle access on and off site when needed.

Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community and the environment. These measures include:

- separating vehicle and pedestrian access
- reducing our noise as much as possible and turning off equipment when not in use
- protecting trees with no-go areas
- erosion and sediment controls
- targeting lighting to minimise light spill
- replanting trees in accordance with the landscaping plan

Traffic impacts

For the safety of our workers and road users, there will be temporary traffic signals and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h.

A reduced speed limit of 60km/h will apply out of work hours until the project is complete.

Bells Line of Road will remain open while we work, however drivers may experience queues of up to 500 metres and should allow ten minutes of extra travel time.
