

Upcoming work on Bridge Road

Bridge Road Cycleway, Glebe

November 2025



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gadigal, Wangal and Bidjigal people of the Eora Nation as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is continuing work to deliver a range of improvements to Bridge Road, including an upgraded cycleway, two raised pedestrian crossings and a resurfaced road.

What work are we doing?

Trenching and backfilling work is complete on Bridge Road and we are moving into the final stages of delivery, when permanent changes are becoming more noticeable.

Our work has taken place while work has also been carried out by others along and beside Bridge Road, which has caused us delays. Wet weather earlier this year has also affected the scheduling of work, including trenching and asphaltting.

However, we're on track to finish work by early 2026 and we've:

- Carried out survey work to identify the location of underground utilities
- Restored trenches, by backfilling and compacting
- Resurfaced sections of road.

Upcoming work

November work will include:

- Delivering a new smooth road surface for Bridge Road
- Installing concrete separators for the permanent cycleway barrier
- Construction of new ramps to provide access between the cycleway and the footpath
- Line marking

- Electrical work to provide upgraded lighting for the raised pedestrian crossing near Cross Street.

These upgrades will make Bridge Road safer and more accessible for everyone, whether you are walking, bike riding or driving.

Night work

Due to the volume of traffic on Bridge Road, most work can only be done out of hours and on weekends. Line marking and painting the new road surface is planned to take place midweek across the project area. This will be quieter and lower impact than work such as jackhammering and saw cutting.

When and where we'll be working

We'll be working along the full length of Bridge Road from **Lyons Road to Wentworth Park Road** in November. There may be some day work.

From **Saturday 8 to Tuesday 11 November**, we'll work from **Ross Street to Railway Street**.

We'll be working from **8pm Saturday to 5am Tuesday**.

What will this mean for you?

We'll be using excavators, jack hammers, saw cutters and machines to remove the road surface, as well as compaction equipment, concrete agitators and tipper trucks. The work will be noisy at times.

You'll also notice:

- Temporary traffic changes, road closures and reduced speed limits
- Footpath closures



- Detours with traffic controllers on site to guide people using sections of the footpath and cycleway.

Traffic control will be in place to help guide road users during this time. Please observe traffic change information and traffic control directions.

Managing our impacts

We appreciate that residents and businesses have been patient through the work. We understand that night work can cause disruption, particularly due to noise, light and vibration from construction machinery. To help reduce these impacts, we're continuing to put mitigation measures in place, including:

- Turning off machinery when not in use
- Installing noise-reducing blankets and shade cloths around work areas
- Pointing lights away from residential buildings where possible
- Using quieter equipment

- Fitting machines with noise suppression mufflers to reduce engine noise.

We are working no more than three nights in the same area to provide respite from impacts.

Property access will continue to be maintained at all times.

Staying up to date

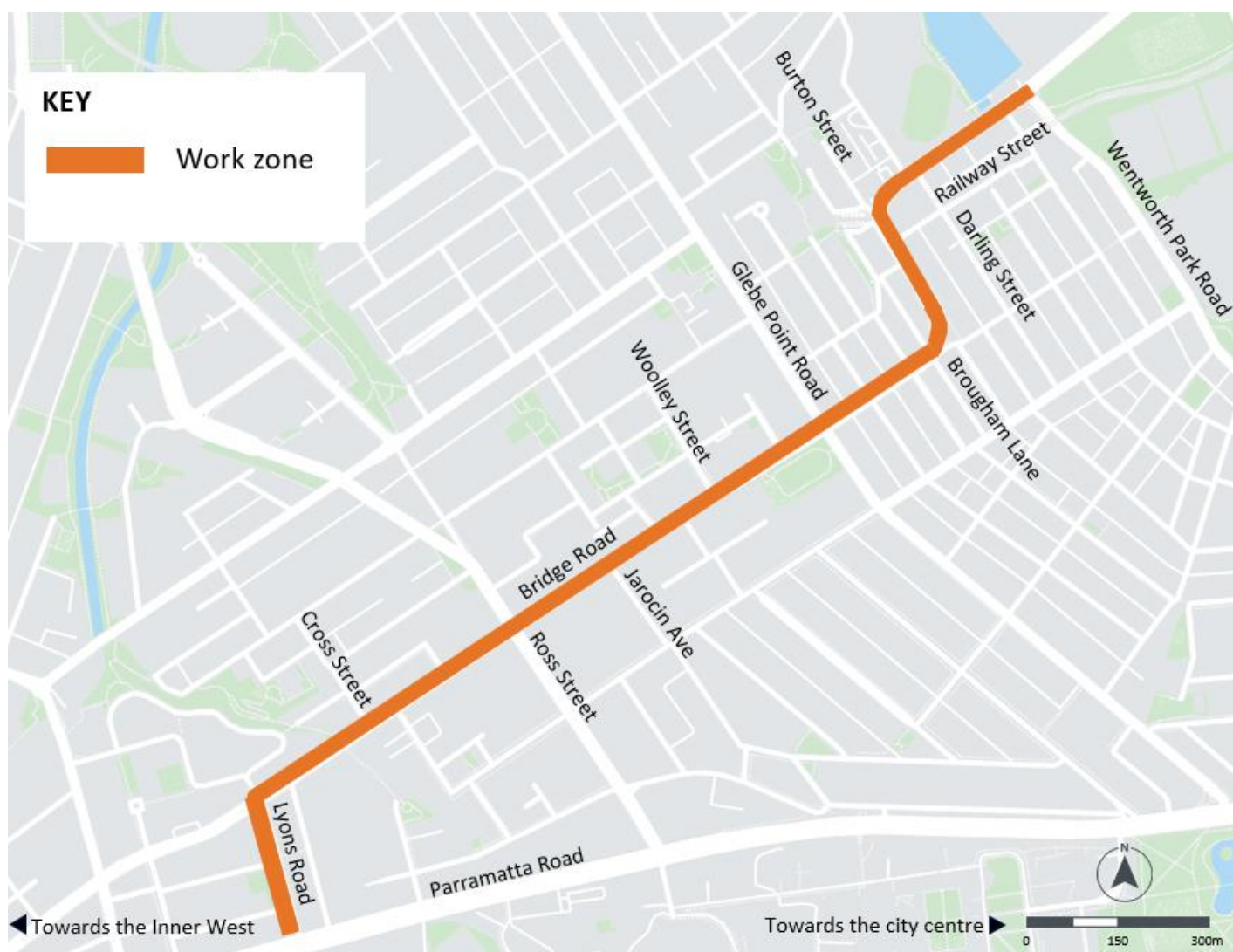
As we move into the final stages of the project, we'll issue out of hours works notices according to confirmed areas of work closer to the time.

Residents directly impacted by night work during the week will be notified by letterbox drops and residents impacted over the weekend will be notified by letterbox drops and doorknocking.

We'll continue to give at least five working days' notice before work. All our community updates will continue to be uploaded to the project webpage.
