Early work for the final stage of work for Wallendbeen Bridge

Transport for NSW has built a new road over rail bridge on Burley Griffin Way at Wallendbeen

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we've built the stronger, safer, wider Wallendbeen Bridge. The first stage of work is now complete, with Abergeldie completing the construction of the bridge structure this month.

We are now preparing to start work on building the road approaches to connect Burley Griffin Way to the new bridge. The new road approaches will be built about 20 metres southwest of the existing crossing

and involve realigning the intersections of Silo, North Jindalee, Morrisons Hill and Cemetery roads.

Early work is due to start on **Monday 31 March** to establish the site ahead of the construction work that is expected to start in May.

Work involves setting up fencing and removing vegetation and will be followed by construction of the approach roads.

When and where we'll be working

Early work is due to start on **Monday 31 March** and is expected to take about four weeks to complete. We'll be working weekdays between 7am and 5pm, weather permitting.

We'll share more information with the community once we have finalised the work program for the road approaches.

The speed limit on North Jindalee and Morrison Hill roads will be reduced to 40 km/h within the work site. Road users are advised to expect delays of up to 10 minutes during work hours.
