1. Introduction

1.1 Introduction

Transport for NSW is constructing the M12 Motorway (the project) to provide direct access between the Western Sydney International Airport (WSIA) at Badgerys Creek and Sydney's motorway network.

Approval for the project under the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act) was granted by the Minister for Planning on 23 April 2021. Approval for the project under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) was granted on 3 June 2021 (EPBC reference 2018/8286).

1.2 Purpose of this report

The purpose of this report is to document compliance with the conditions for the EPBC Act Approval 2018/8286 in accordance with Condition 10. This report covers the period between 02 November 2023 and 02 November 2024 (the reporting period).

2. Description of activities

2.1 Overview of the project

Transport for NSW are delivering the M12 Motorway project between the M7 Motorway at Cecil Hills and The Northern Road at Luddenham, over a distance of about 16 km.

The project includes the following:

- A new dual-carriageway motorway between the M7 Motorway and The Northern Road with two lanes in each direction with a central median allowing future expansion to six lanes
- Motorway access via three interchanges/intersections:
 - A motorway-to-motorway interchange at the M7 Motorway and associated works (extending about 4 km within the existing M7 Motorway corridor) with connection between the M12 Motorway and Elizabeth Drive
 - A grade-separated interchange referred to as the WSIA interchange, including a dual-carriageway four-lane airport access road (two lanes in each direction for about 1.5 km) connecting with the Western Sydney International Airport Main Access Road
 - A signalised intersection at The Northern Road with provision for grade separation in the future
- Bridge structures across Ropes Creek, Kemps Creek, South Creek, Badgerys Creek and Cosgroves Creek
- A bridge structure across the M12 Motorway into the Western Sydney Parklands to maintain access to the existing water tower and mobile telephone/other service

- towers on the ridgeline in the vicinity of Cecil Hills, to the west of the M7 Motorway
- Bridge structures at interchanges and at Clifton Avenue, Elizabeth Drive,
 Luddenham Road and other local roads to maintain local access and connectivity
- Inclusion of active transport (pedestrian and cyclist) facilities through provision of pedestrian bridges and an off-road shared user path, including connections to existing and future shared user path networks
- Modifications to the local road network, as required, to facilitate connections across and around the M12 Motorway, including:
 - Realignment of Elizabeth Drive at the WSIA, with Elizabeth Drive bridging over the airport access road and the future passenger rail line to the airport
 - Two new signalised intersections from Elizabeth Drive into the WSIA, with provisions for future connection to potential developments to the north
 - Widening of Elizabeth Drive under the M7 Motorway and approaches
 - Realignment of Clifton Avenue over the M12 Motorway, with associated adjustments to nearby property access
- Relocation of the Salisbury Avenue cul-de-sac, on the southern side of the M12 Motorway
- Realignment of Wallgrove Road north of its intersection with Elizabeth Drive to accommodate the M7 Motorway northbound entry ramp
- Realignment of Wallgrove Road to connect to Cecil Road, including a connection between Elizabeth Drive and Wallgrove Road via Cecil Road with a signalised intersection with Elizabeth Drive
- Adjustment, protection or relocation of existing utilities
- Ancillary facilities to support motorway operations, smart motorways operation in the future and the existing M7 Motorway operation, including gantries, electronic signage and ramp metering
- Other roadside furniture including safety barriers, signage and street lighting
- Adjustments of waterways, where required, including Kemps Creek, South Creek and Badgerys Creek
- Permanent water quality management measures including swales and basins
- Establishment and use of temporary ancillary facilities, temporary construction sedimentation basins, access tracks and haul roads during construction
- Permanent and temporary property adjustments and property access refinements as required.

2.2 Activities undertaken during the reporting period

2.2.1 Early works

Early works packages are complete as outlined in the previous reporting period – refer to EPBC Report January 2024.

2.2.2 Construction works

The project is being delivered by four separate contractors as described in **Table 2-2**. During the reporting period construction continued on the M12 West, M12 Central and M12 East packages and work was completed on the M12 Central roundabout package.

- Bridgeworks, including installation of bridge girders (completed), bridge deck construction and finishing works
- Spray seal and all machine paving on the main alignment completed
- Finishing works for kerb & gutter, verge placement and concrete barrier slip forming works commenced
- Intelligent Transport Systems & Street Light installation in progress

- Sitewide drainage, permanent fencing, pedestrian fencing, VMS structures, signage, shared path lighting, wire rope & guard rail ongoing
- Mulch importation commenced, following a stringent process to ensure no contamination

4. New environmental risks

4.1 Red Imported Fire Ants

Red imported fire ants (*Solenopsis invicta*) are regulated as prohibited matter under the *Biosecurity Act 2015*. During the reporting period the *NSW Biosecurity (Fire Ant) Emergency Order (No 1) 2024* and the *NSW Biosecurity (Fire Ant) Emergency Amendment Order 2024* were introduced to regulate the potential spread of fire ants in fire ant carrier material. Carrier material includes soil, sand, quarry material, organic waste, potted plants, mulch, manure, earth moving equipment, hay, turf. The movement of carrier materials from Queensland and Fire Ant Movement Control Areas is subject to requirements as per the Order.

The Overarching and Contractor Construction Flora and Fauna Management Plans were updated to include details of required fire ant awareness training and management actions needed in this regard.



I refer to the letter dated 27 August 2024 to the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (department) regarding a potential breach of approval conditions for The M12 Motorway Project between the M7 Motorway, Cecil Hills and the Northern Road, (EPBC 2018/8286).

Section 142 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) states that it is an offence to take an action, or omit to take an action, that contravenes a condition of approval.

The requirement to comply with a condition of approval also applies to any party, such as a contractor, that was informed of the condition and could reasonably have been expected to be aware of the condition.

After reviewing a range of information including the information provided in the incident report and information provided by Transport for New South Wales on 25 September 2024 indicating was aware of the requirements of the conditions of approval for EPBC approval 2018/8286, the department has formed the view that has contravened condition 5 of EPBC 2018/8286.

Condition 5 relates to the implementation of several conditions required by the NSW Infrastructure approval, including condition C10. Condition C10 of the State Infrastructure Approval requires that the project's Flora and Fauna Management Plan is implemented.

Section 5.2.1 of the project's Flora and Fauna Management Plan sets out the limit for area directly impacted by the project for Plant Community Type 830 (Grey Box shrubby woodland on shale of the southern Cumberland Plain, Sydney Basin Bioregion), which is 0.44ha.

In this case, condition C10 has been contravened as the clearing in question exceeded the 0.44ha clearing limit for Plant Community Type 830 (Grey Box shrubby woodland on shale of the southern Cumberland Plain, Sydney Basin Bioregion).

As measures to prevent reoccurrence have been implemented and the ecological impact is likely not severe the department has concluded that in this instance, issuing an infringement notice is not an appropriate response. As such, the department is issuing a warning letter to for contravening section 142 of the EPBC Act. This letter serves as the

warning notice and finalises the compliance matter relating to condition 5 of approval EPBC 2018/8286

Please note that this matter will be recorded and considered to be part of your environmental history and may be considered in any future dealings with the department in relation to the EPBC Act. Please ensure that you continue to maintain accurate records associated with, or relevant to, the conditions of the approval, to the extent undertakes the action approved by EPBC 2018/8286. Such documents and records may be used in the future to verify compliance with the conditions of the approval.





1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project Background






Figure 1-1: M12 Motorway staging

TfNSW is planning to construct and operate the M12 Motorway to provide direct access between the Western Sydney International Airport (WSIA) at Badgerys Creek and Sydney's motorway network (the Project). The M12 Motorway will run between the M7 Motorway at Cecil Hills and The Northern Road at Luddenham for about 16 kilometres (km) and is expected to be opened to traffic prior to opening of the WSIA around mid-2026 (Figure 1-1).

The Project has been delivered in multiple separate packages under separate contracts:

- M12 West between The Northern Road, Luddenham and about 250 metres east of Badgerys Creek
- M12 Central (main construction) between about 250 metres east of Badgerys Creek and the Western Sydney Parklands at Duff Road, Cecil Park
- M12 Central (Temporary Roundabout) temporary roundabout installation at Elizabeth Drive and Devonshire Road, Kemps Creek
- M12 East (as part of the M7/M12 Integration Project)
 - Elizabeth Drive Connections (EDC) a two-kilometre section from Duff Road to about 300 metres east of the M7 Motorway
 - M7/M12 Interchange An interchange between the M12 Motorway and M7 Motorway and tie-in works for approximately four kilometres on the M7 Motorway M12 West – between The Northern Road, Luddenham and about 250 metres east of Badgerys Creek

The Project is subject to an approval under Division 5.2 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act) as Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) (SSI-9364). The Project is also a controlled action under Section 75 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act), requiring a separate approval from the Australian Minister for the Environment and Water.

An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was prepared to describe and assess the Project and recommend management measures to address impacts. The EIS was exhibited by the former NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) (now split into the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure and Environment (DPHI) and NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (NSW DCCEEW)) for 34 days from 16 October 2019 to 18 November 2019 to give the community and stakeholders the opportunity to provide comment. The EIS assessed the impacts of construction of the Project on flora and fauna. As part of EIS development, a detailed Biodiversity Assessment Report (BAR) (Arcadis, 2019) was prepared to address the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) issued by the DPIE and the Commonwealth EIS Guidelines issued by the Commonwealth Department of the Water, Agriculture and Environment (DAWE) (now Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW). The BAR, including a Biodiversity Offset Strategy (BOS), was included in the EIS as Appendix E.

In accordance with Section 5.17 of the EP&A Act, the Secretary requested TfNSW to provide a response to submissions on 29 November 2019 to address the identified issues. Due to design developments since the exhibition of the EIS, an Amendment Report was developed to assess the impacts of these amendments. The Amendment Report was exhibited by DPIE for 14 days from 21 October 2020 to 4 November 2020 and included further assessment of flora and fauna impacts detailed in a Biodiversity Supplementary Technical Report (Arcadis, 2019; Appendix A of the Amendment Report). The additional assessment considered the impacts on flora and fauna due to refinements in the Project design, including changes in the Project footprint, and the results of

additional flora and fauna surveys which could be undertaken as property access was available during the Spring Survey time.

Following exhibition of the Amendment Report, an Amendment Report Submissions Report (ARSR) was developed December 2020 to address the identified issues followed by the ARSR – Amendment in March 2021 which addressed biodiversity matters only.

Approval for the Project under the EP&A Act was granted by the NSW Minister for Planning on 23 April 2021 (SSI-9364); approval under the EPBC Act was granted by the Commonwealth Minister for the Environment on 3 June 2021 (EPBC 2018/8286).

1.1.1 Changes to the approved Project

Following Project approval in April 2021, detailed design development, verification surveys, spring surveys and targeted species surveys undertaken to meet seasonal requirements resulted in changes to the final construction footprint and associated impacts to native vegetation and threatened species. As such, consistency assessment reports were developed to assess the changes to the approved Project.

Each consistency assessment (CA) and associated justification are detailed in Table 1-1. Consistency assessments associated with M12 East will be reported on separately within the M12 East Biodiversity Offset Report.

1.1.2 Verification surveys

Verification surveys were carried out in accordance with NSW CoA E4, E5 and E6. This required consultation with NSW Environment, Energy and Science Group (EES) (formerly Environment and Heritage Group) (EHG), now NSW DCCEEW) including advice and input on the following project surveys:

- M12 West verification surveys
- M12 threatened species spring surveys
- M12 targeted species surveys for Pimelea spicata and Micromyrtus minutiflora.

The M12 West verification surveys were undertaken on 17 June 2021 by WSP in accordance with NSW CoA E5 and E6. The verification survey focused on the areas of vegetation and habitat along the Northern Road, Elizabeth Drive, and Badgerys Creek areas (Sydney University and BHL land). The verification survey report was submitted to EES on 4 August 2021 who provided comment on the report on 1 September 2021. The verification surveys updated clearing impacts reporting and ecosystem and species credits have been incorporated into the M12 West Detailed Design Consistency Assessment, as detailed in Table 1-1.

Threatened species spring surveys were undertaken between September and December 2021 in accordance with NSW CoA E4, E5 and E6. The surveys were undertaken for threatened species impacted by the Project as well as ten other threatened flora species with potential habitat within and adjoining the Project footprint. Two threatened flora species including *Dillwynia tenuifolia* and *Pultenaea parviflora* were found during the surveys. The additional individuals and species credits have been incorporated into the Design Boundary Change Consistency Assessment as detailed in Table 1-1.

Separate targeted species surveys for *Pimelea spicata* (Arcadis June, 2021) were undertaken during the spring surveying in accordance with NSW CoA E8 in March, April and June 2021. Targeted surveys were conducted within the refined construction footprint between four and five weeks after >30mm rainfall events recorded at Badgerys Creek Automatic Weather Station (station 067108). No *Pimelea spicata* species were detected within the surveyed areas and therefore NSW CoA E9 was not triggered. Surveys also undertaken for *Micromyrtus minutiflora*. No species were found.

Consultation was undertaken with EES in accordance with NSW CoA E6 for the targeted species surveys. This was submitted to EES on 28 January 2021. ESS provided comment on 11 February 2022. EES stated that although specific survey requirements for *Micromyrtus minutiflora* and *Pimelea spicata* were not achieved, they raise no further comments or concerns in relation to the methodology adopted, because:

- Surveys for Pimelea spicata, were very close to meeting requirements of being within 4 weeks of rainfall
- *Micromyrtus minutiflora* has never been recorded in the vicinity of the subject site and the areas of potential habitat have been well surveyed. The likelihood the species being present is low.
- The methodology includes a mitigation measure around unexpected finds for these species which EES supports.

1.2 Scope of this Report

This report has been prepared in accordance with NSW CoA E4 to:

- Confirm the final construction footprint for the West and Central packages, noting M12 East is subject to further project refinements (see Section 1.3) in accordance with NSW CoA E3 and Commonwealth CoA 2
- Provide information on the extent and type of Plant Community Types (PCT) to be cleared, and the
 extent of threatened species habitat impacted by the construction of the Project (excluding certified
 areas) for M12 West and M12 Central

• Document the ecosystem and species credit requirements, review and update carried out by TfNSW in accordance with NSW CoA E4, E5 and E6.

While the scope of this report is focussed on M12 West and M12 Central, Section 2 discusses the updated native vegetation clearing extents and the associated ecosystem and species credits for the Project as a whole, as that is how clearing and offset obligations are described in NSW CoA E3 and Commonwealth CoA 4.




Figure 1-2: M12 West and Central native vegetation areas overview




Figure 1-3: M12 West construction footprint and native vegetation areas




Figure 1-4: M12 Central construction footprint and native vegetation areas

The final construction footprint for M12 West and M12 Central is presented in Figure 1-2, Figure 1-3 and Figure 1-4. A new interface area was established in M12 Central and M12 East (see Figure 1-4) following Project approval. In terms of the increase of the construction footprint in this area, clearing impact areas and ecosystem and species credits, all associated native vegetation in this interface area is considered to be a part of M12 Central only.

1.3 Future M12 East Refinements

Future modifications or refinements to the Project may result from detailed design refinement or changed construction footprint with the development of M12 East stage. This stage includes Elizabeth Drive Connections and the M7/M12 interchange which are being delivered as part of the M7/M12 Integration Project. There is potential for additional impacts to native vegetation and ecosystem and species credits. Where changes to the areas of native vegetation occur, a review of this report will be undertaken by TfNSW as the M12 East stage progresses.

TfNSW will consult with Commonwealth DCCEEW and NSW DCCEEW regarding changes to the native vegetation impacts and ecosystem and species credits and this report will be submitted to the Planning Secretary for approval within six months of determining the final construction footprint for M12 East in accordance with CoA E4 and Commonwealth CoA 2.

1.4 Consultation

In accordance with NSW CoA E4 and Commonwealth CoA 2 and CoA 4, consultation has been undertaken with Commonwealth DCCEEW and EHG regarding the amendments to the ecosystem and species credit requirements.

TfNSW initially contacted EHG and Commonwealth DCCEEW on 30 June 2023 by email, attaching this document, to provide comment on the variation of biodiversity credits. TfNSW then contacted EHG and Commonwealth DCCEEW by email, attaching the updated version of this document, on the 12 December 2023 to provide comment on further variations to the biodiversity credits. Table 1-2 details the correspondence on this document. Appendix A provides evidence of consultation undertaken.

In accordance with NSW CoA E4, this report was to be submitted to the Planning Secretary for approval within six months of determining the final construction footprint of each stage. Additionally, in accordance with NSW CoA E3, TfNSW was required to meet their biodiversity obligations for ecosystem and species credit requirements within 12 months of the commencement of construction. Construction for the M12 West Stage of the project commenced on August 18th 2022 and therefore the credits were to be retired by August 18th 2023. However, as the construction footprint was not yet finalised, a letter detailing the final construction footprint for the M12 West and Central stages of the project and a request for an extension of time to retire credits under CoA E4 was sent to the Department Planning and Environment (DPE; now DPHI and NSW DCCEEW) on August 10th 2023. An extension of time was granted until February 18th 2024.

2 ASSESSMENT

This section includes a review of the Project Approval (SSI 9364) ecosystem and species credits and the updated direct and indirect impacts to native vegetation and associated ecosystem credits and impacts to threatened flora and fauna and species credits for the Project.

2.1 Review Process

As described in Section 1.1.1, several detailed design changes, consistency assessments, seasonal surveys and verification surveys have been undertaken since the Project Approval (April, 2021). This has triggered the need for a review and update of credit requirements in accordance with NSW CoA E4, E5 and E6. The following methodology was undertaken to review and update the impact areas for the Project vegetation mapping:

- Prior to clearing (TfNSW):
 - Seasonal survey or verification survey undertaken
 - If a boundary change was required, a Consistency Assessment was undertaken including biodiversity assessment and site inspection undertaken to determine biodiversity impacts (if any)
 - Ecologists verified the impact areas required for clearing in terms of the extent, type and condition of threatened species and ecological communities to be impacted. Where appropriate, vegetation types were attributed to either PCT and/or Threated Ecological Community (TEC); this was reflected in Project mapping.
- During construction (Construction Contractors):
 - Flagging of exclusion zones as identified on the Sensitive Area Plans detailed in the Overarching Construction Environmental Management Plan (OCEMP)
 - Where areas of vegetation to be retained can be retained, these are also flagged as exclusion zones on site
 - Clearing extents surveyed and marked out on site as per the Construction Flora and Fauna Management Plan (CFFMP)
 - Clearing within the approved native vegetation impact area is undertaken in accordance with the procedures outlined in the CFFMP
 - The cleared area is surveyed and data provided to TfNSW
- During construction (TfNSW):
 - The survey data collected is reviewed against the approved impact areas and updated in the Project vegetation mapping via the M12 Project Vegetation Tracking Portal to reflect the current native vegetation areas
 - Verified clearing areas and limits communicated to Construction Contractor
- Verification (Arcadis/TfNSW):
 - A review and verification of survey data methodology, PCT and TEC impact area, and GIS data versus reported data has been undertaken to rationalise data collected from the field and reported in each assessment document. This was undertaken to ensure that the data reported is accurate and up to date. Data was updated to consistently report to three decimal places.
 - During a review of the ecosystem and species credits credit requirements in August 2023, it
 was identified that there were some inconsistencies in data reporting; the updated numbers are
 reflected within the tables provided within this report. These inconsistencies were due to:
 - Recording methodologies for threatened flora species Pultenaea parviflora and Dillwynia tenuifolia were identified to be inconsistent between surveys with either multiple clumped individuals of a species being recorded as singular GIS data points or number of stems

recorded as multiple GIS points. This led to an increase in the number of *Pultenaea* parviflora credits required and a decrease in the number of *Dillwynia tenuifolia* credits required

 Surveys undertaken identifying additional hollow bearing tree component of habitat for Southern Myotis was identified in the GIS data but not transferred into reporting.

2.2 Ecosystem Credits

2.2.1 Changes to Direct Impacts

Changes to direct impacts to PCT and the associated updated ecosystem credit requirements for the Project are shown in Table 2-1. Direct impacts and ecosystem credits have been separated into each associated PCT and by vegetation zone code. A sum of the total direct impacts has been included for each PCT and the associated ecosystem credits.

Two Threatened Ecological Communities (TEC) identified in the construction footprint meet the criteria for listing under the EPBC Act in accordance with Commonwealth CoA 4 including:

- Cumberland Plain Shale Woodlands and Shale-Gravel Transition Forest
- · Western Sydney Dry Rainforest and Moist Woodland on Shale.

By applying the Framework for Biodiversity Assessment (Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH), 2014), residual impacts on EPBC Act listed TEC must be offset with PCTs that are ascribed to the specific EPBC listed TEC (Table 2-2). PCT identified as TEC was determined through ground truthing during ecological surveys and identified as TEC in the Project mapping. The Project mapping was used to determine changes in direct and indirect impacts to TEC.

It should be noted the TEC impacts are not in addition to the total clearing extent impacts for the Project.

2.2.2 Changes to Indirect Impacts

The Project will result in indirect impacts to some areas of native vegetation adjoining the construction footprint, mainly due to fragmentation of vegetation and creation of new edges, which may result in edge effects. As reported in the Biodiversity Assessment Report (TfNSW EIS, 2019), a 30 metre buffer was applied from the edge of the construction footprint and an analysis of native vegetation mapped within the buffer zone was conducted. The analysis focused on the potential for edge effects such as changes to vegetation structure, increase in exotic species cover and alteration of microhabitats to occur within the buffer zone as a result of the Project. Five categories for potential edge effects were determined that are detailed in Table 2-3.

Category	Description
Non-viable fragment	Small fragments of vegetation (<0.2 ha) left between clearing or adjacent to other permanent disturbance. These vegetation fragments are considered no longer viable in the long-term. This vegetation is located between the construction footprint and Elizabeth Drive.
New edge	Vegetation patch will be fragmented by the construction footprint to form one or more new edges within previously unfragmented vegetation. Note some of these areas are still currently subject to disturbance.

The identified indirect impacts to PCT and the updated ecosystem credit requirements for the Project are shown in Table 2-4. Indirect impacts and ecosystem credits have been separated into each associated PCT and by vegetation zone code. A sum of the total indirect impacts has been included for each PCT and the associated ecosystem credits.

Two TEC identified in the construction footprint meet the criteria for listing under the EPBC Act in accordance with Commonwealth CoA 4 including:

- Cumberland Plain Shale Woodlands and Shale-Gravel Transition Forest
- Western Sydney Dry Rainforest and Moist Woodland on Shale.

By applying the Framework for Biodiversity Assessment (OEH, 2014), residual impacts on EPBC Act listed TEC must be offset with PCT that are ascribed to the specific EPBC listed ecological community (Table 2-5).

The total impact area and associated ecosystem credits are not in addition to what has been recorded for PCT impact areas.

2.3 Changes to Species Credits

The identified impacts to species credits including threatened flora and fauna species, and the updated species credit requirements are shown in Table 2-6. The change in the number of threatened flora species is due to additional spring surveys being undertaken between September and December 2021 (described in Table 1-1) and access being provided to properties that had previously been denied in April 2021.

2.4 Areas of Vegetation to be Retained

Areas of vegetation to be retained corresponding to a PCT have been nominated in several locations within the construction footprint as reported in the M12 Consistency Assessments listed in Table 1-1. These areas are flagged as exclusion zones on site and present a potential opportunity for the Construction Contractor to avoid and minimise vegetation impacts where it is reasonable and feasible to do so. These areas total about 3.71 ha across the Project.

However, as vegetation impacts may still occur within the "areas to be retained' during construction, these impacts have been considered in biodiversity off-set calculations.

2.5 Offset Obligation Progress

TfNSW has acquired and retired a portion of ecosystem and species credits on the 11th of March 2022 and 22nd of December 2022, and will retire the remaining credits by the 18th of February 2024.

Eco-system credits requirements have been amended due to the final construction footprint across M12 West and M12 Central being confirmed. Table 2-7 and Table 2-8 describes the number of credits required, the number of credits secured and retired by TfNSW and includes the additional number of credits to be retired for the M12 West and M12 Central packages specifically. Currently, TfNSW has secured the required credits to enable retirement for each ecosystem and species nominated by NSW CoA E3 in M12 West and M12 Central packages. M12 East offsets will be retired at a later date in accordance with NSW CoA E4.

3 CONCLUSION



EHG has reviewed the M12 Motorway: Update to Ecosystem and Species Credits Requirements Report prepared by Arcadis (26 June 2023) and notes:

- Condition of Approval (CoA) E4 allows for the revision of credit requirements.
- CoA E5 allows credit requirements to be revised via a review of existing mapping and any final/revised development footprint prepared and/or additional ecological surveys undertaken.
- CoA E6 requires that additional surveys are to be undertaken in consultation with EHG, which has occurred.
- During the briefing provided by TfNSW on 19 July, it was indicated that the revised development footprint has been based on what has been cleared for the project.
- EHG has not reviewed shapefiles or other data in relation to the updated ecosystem and species credit requirements however no comments or concerns are raised in relation to the approach taken to review and update credit obligations.



- a. Acquiring and retiring "biodiversity credits" within the meaning of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016; and/or
- b. Properties secured with the NPWS, on the basis of a draft credit report to show what the property would provide and written confirmation from NPWS that the financial contributions for acquisition and management have been received; and/or
- c. Making a payment into the Biodiversity Conservation Fund; or




