Community invited to celebrate old and new at Moss Vale Station

Tuesday, 15 July 2025

The Moss Vale community is invited to join in the celebrations to mark the completion of major safety and accessibility upgrades at Moss Vale Station, as part of the Minns Labor Government's commitment to strengthening regional communities.

The \$68 million upgrade is delivering a safer, more accessible and more modern station precinct that better meets the needs of all passengers, including people with disability, those with limited mobility, parents and carers with prams, and travellers with luggage.

These upgrades are being delivered as part of the Minns Labor Government's broader program to upgrade stations and prepare for the introduction of the new Regional Rail fleet across NSW.

The station improvements include new lifts at both ends of the Argyle Street footbridge. Once complete, a third lift will also be available on the Lackey Road footbridge. Further improvements will enhance the Lackey Road entrance, forecourt and Dalys Way access.

Importantly, Moss Vale Station will now meet the Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 (DSAPT) and comply with the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA), helping ensure equitable access for all.

To celebrate this milestone, the local community is invited to a family-friendly event from 11:00am on Saturday 26 July 2025. The event will feature an official opening, plaque unveiling, community barbecue and a stop from the Picnic steam train. It will bring together Moss Vale's proud past and bright future.

In addition to new accessibility features, the upgraded station pays homage to Moss Vale's rich Aboriginal and rail history through historical signage, public art, storytelling installations and gallery-style displays.

A key heritage feature includes a display of preserved sandstone uncovered during works. It is now showcased near the Dalys Way entrance as part of the station's Heritage Interpretation Plan.

A range of other artefacts have also been uncovered during archaeological investigations, including the remains of a 75-foot train turntable, bottles, ash pits and inspection pits.

Work is also continuing at the nearby stabling yard to support the new regional train fleet. This includes foundation works and the installation of steel columns for a new noise barrier along Lackey Road. The stabling yard upgrade is expected to be completed by late 2025.

This project is another example of the Minns Labor Government's commitment to strengthening
