



Moss Vale Station and Stabling Yard Upgrade

Community notification

July 2025



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gundungurra people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The NSW Government is investing in an upgrade to Moss Vale Station and Stabling Yard to make the station more accessible and to accommodate the new Regional Rail fleet.

The project will achieve Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 (DSAPT) compliance, providing a station precinct that is accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage, while ensuring it aligns with the community's transport needs.

What work are we doing?

Over the next month, we will continue carrying out construction and landscaping activities in and around the station and stabling yard, as well as on Argyle Street, Lackey Road and Dalys Way.

During this period we will:

- work on the pedestrian footpath and lift entrance on Lackey Road
- landscape in front of the new noise wall
- Repave and set up new parking, signage and directional line marking on Dalys Way and at the station entrance.

At the stabling yard we will:

- continue to work on the high voltage power upgrade and train refuelling bay
- install additional track.

What does this mean for you?

Pedestrian access along Dalys Way has already been reinstated, with access along the eastern side. The Argyle Street footbridge and lifts will remain permanently open for use.

The small commuter car park adjacent to Diamond Jubilee Park is now open to the public.

Vehicle access to the station via Dalys Way will reopen from mid-July (weather permitting).

Once reopened:

- all regional buses will arrive and depart from the station entrance
- parking next to Diamond Jubilee Garden will be managed by Wingecarribee Shire Council
- new disability compliant parking, kiss and ride and taxi zones will be marked near the station entrance.

Lackey Road will continue to have intermittent traffic control, including some temporary lane closures, to enable the delivery of new track for the upgraded stabling yard.

The Lackey Road footbridge and lift will reopen from mid-July (weather permitting). The current shuttle bus service between Garret Street and Argyle Street will remain in place until the footbridge reopens.





Work has steadily continued on the Lackey Road footbridge.

When will we be working?

Most work will take place during standard construction hours from **7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday**, apart from the weekend work mentioned.

Out-of-hours work

We will be working at the station between **6am and 6pm on Saturday 12 July**. For the safety of staff and passengers, this work will take place during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork period when no trains are running, and the station is closed.
