The Rail Service Improvement
Program, formerly known as More
Trains, More Services enables a safer,
more equitable, and integrated
transport network where people can
travel more safely, reliably, and
efficiently across NSW.

What work are we doing?

In March, adjustments to overhead wiring infrastructure and removal of redundant infrastructure will occur along the rail corridor (subject to work approvals).

You may have received previous notification of this work in December 2024.

When and where we'll be working

Work will take place inside the rail corridor at Seven Hills and Schofields between:

- Burnie Street and McCoy Street in Seven Hills
- Swordfish Street and Advance Street in Schofields.

Temporary site compounds for plant, worker parking, and access will be established:

- within the rail corridor between Railway Terrace to Burdekin Road, Schofields
- via Seven Hills Station carpark at Terminus Road (access only), with temporary parking removal on Hartley Road and within the rail corridor between Station Road and Endeavour Street.

Some site set up activities may occur during standard construction hours this month.

Standard construction hours on this project are between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am and 1pm on Saturdays.

Out of hours work

In March, some work is required to take place outside of standard construction hours.

This work will take place between:

 6pm Wednesday 5 March and 7am Wednesday 12 March.

Why we work outside of standard hours

We schedule work outside of standard construction hours to take place during Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running. This minimises disruptions to commuter services and improves the safety of our construction team and customers.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- increase in construction workers and vehicles
- temporary street parking along Hartley Road
- noise from machinery and equipment.

At times you may also notice early warning safety alarms from within the rail corridor alerting our workers that a train is approaching nearby on adjacent track lines. This is a critical safety measure and may be sounded more than once.

Managing our impacts

We understand construction activities may cause disruption to our closest neighbours, and every effort will be made to minimise impacts where possible, including:



- locating equipment as far away from residents and businesses as possible
- ensuring lighting towers are directed downwards and away from residents
- compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise.

Protected industrial action

Protected industrial action has recently been taking place in New South Wales, which may again lead to future changes and last-minute rescheduling of Program work. We will make every effort to notify you of changes that occur due to this industrial action. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.
