The NSW Government is investing \$19 million towards intersection upgrades on the Woy Woy peninsula

Transport for NSW will deliver upgrades to the following intersections along Blackwall Road, Woy Woy:

- Intersection of Memorial Avenue, Barrenjoey Road and Maitland Bay Drive.
- Blackwall and McMasters Road intersection
- Intersections at Blackwall, Allfield and Farnell Roads.

What work are we doing?

We are currently working to progress upgrades to intersections on Blackwall Road. We are working through the most efficient way to carry out the upgrades. The work will be completed in stages.

The watermain component of the project will commence at the intersection of Memorial Avenue and Barrenjoey Road in late August.

This work may involve a detour where pedestrians and cyclists will be redirected via Banksia Street to avoid the shared footpath on Barrenjoey Road. Signage will be in place to assist pedestrians and cyclists. Please see map below for further information.

Work at this intersection will continue for around one year, weather permitting.

When and where we'll be working

We'll be continuing day work at the Maitland Bay Drive and Memorial Avenue intersection throughout August.

Working hours are **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday** and **8am to 1pm, Saturday.** Some night work will be required.

Night work

Night work will be required to prepare for essential watermain work at the intersection of Memorial Avenue and Barrenjoey Road.

We'll be working from **Sunday 24 August,** from **7pm-5am, Saturday to Thursday** for **one week**, weather permitting.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- Workers and vehicles
- Plant items and machinery
- A reduced speed limit around the site compound to 60 km/h, and 40 km/h during working hours.
- Traffic controllers and signage
- Road closures and reduced speed limits
- Footpath closures
- Pedestrian and cyclist detours with traffic controllers on site to guide you
- Noise from machinery and equipment.



Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Single lane and shoulder closures with traffic control may be in place while equipment is installed at night. A 40km/hr speed limit will be in place both during and outside work hours.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community and the environment.

We will work to minimise our impact as much as possible by:

- Reducing our noise as much as possible and by trying to carry out the noisiest activities by 11pm should we need to carry out night work
- · Targeted lighting to minimise light spill.

What's next?

The project is expected to take about two years to complete.


