

Upcoming work in June on Bridge Road

Bridge Road Cycleway, Glebe

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gadigal, Wangal and Bidjigal people of the Eora Nation as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Work to deliver a range of improvements to Bridge Road, including an upgraded cycleway, two raised pedestrian crossings and a resurfaced road, will continue from Tuesday 3 June.

We're continuing night and weekend work as part of the ongoing construction.

Working at night allows us to minimise disruption to daytime traffic and ensure the safety of workers, road users and the community.

Upcoming night work

From **Tuesday 3 June** to **Monday 30 June**, we'll be working for up to three nights per week at the following locations:

- Pyrmont Bridge and Bridge Roads between Lyons Road and Jarocin Avenue
- Bridge Road near Woolley Street to Darling Street.

Our working hours are from 8pm to 5am Sunday to Thursday. Noisy and high impact work will be carried out before midnight.

Weekend work in June

From **Saturday 21 June** to **Sunday 22 June**, we'll be working between Bellevue Street and Taylor Street, Glebe. Weekend work allows our team to safely complete work that can't be carried out under live traffic conditions and enable us to complete trench restoration work efficiently.

By completing work on weekends, we can reduce the number of weekday disruptions to the community. This approach also helps us maintain a safer work environment and allows the work to be completed more efficiently.

More information, including times and location of weekend work will be provided separately to directly impacted residents through notifications, which will also be uploaded to the project webpage.

What this means for you

To carry out our work, we'll be using concrete saw cutters, excavators, jack hammers, concrete and tipper trucks, and milling and resheeting equipment. You may also notice:

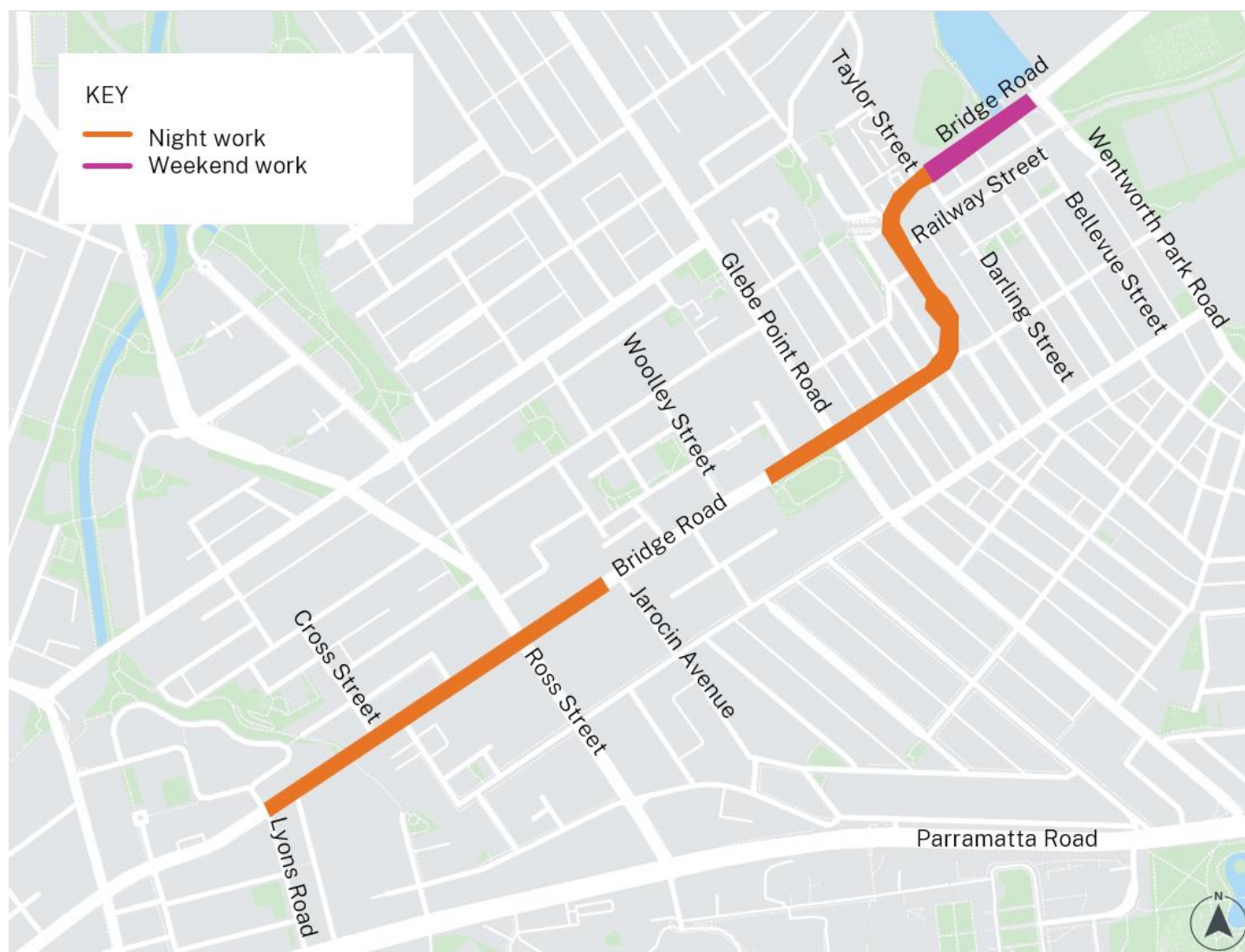
- Workers and vehicles
- Traffic controllers and signage
- Road closures and reduced speed limits
- Footpath closures
- Detours with traffic controllers on site to guide people walking and bike riding
- Noise from machinery and equipment.

Managing our impacts

Our work at night may require the use of machinery that generates noise, light and vibration. To manage this, we'll implement a range of measures such as turning off machinery when not in use, installing noise reducing blankets and shade cloths around construction sites and fitting equipment with devices to minimise noise.
