

# Geotechnical investigations on Brig O'Johnston Bridge, Clarence Town from Monday 17 February

The NSW Government is investing in rehabilitation of the Brig O'Johnston Bridge as part of its bridge maintenance program.

## What work are we doing?

Transport is continuing to plan for the rehabilitation of Brig O'Johnston Bridge, which includes carrying out geotechnical investigation work.

## When and where we'll be working

We'll be working on the bridge from **Monday 17 February** and expect to complete the work in **two weeks**, weather permitting.

Working hours are 7am to 4pm.

### What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- · Workers and vehicles
- Stop slow traffic arrangements with 40km/h speed limit during work hours, which may affect travel times
- Noise from machinery and equipment.

#### What's next?

Transport for NSW is continuing to work with NSW Environment, Energy and Science with planning progressing towards a formal application to approve rehabilitation of the bridge. Following approval, an environmental assessment and delivery options will be prepared for consultation with the community.

Rehabilitation work will commence following completion of the new bridge constructed by Dungog Shire Council. The new bridge will be built alongside the existing Brig O'Johnston Bridge, which will be retained and rehabilitated.
